Jesus asks a penetrating question in this Sunday's Gospel.

"What are you looking for?" The Lord asks the question to two aspiring disciples who have left the side of John the Baptist, but this is a question Jesus asks all of us today. Put yourself in the shoes (or sandals) of the person hearing this question in the Gospel. What would you say? What are you looking for?

This question invites us to go much deeper than more money, more pleasure, more power or more honor/fame. The Lord wants us to delve deeper into our hearts so that we can recognize the longings we have that nothing material can satisfy.

If we're being honest, we'll admit we have a thirst – a hunger – that nothing in this world can completely fulfill. We possess a God-shaped hole in our hearts that only God can sufficiently fill. This is why the spiritual life is so important for us as human beings. We cannot neglect the care of our souls.

So many of our society's ills are directly related to sick souls. There is a dis-ease in so many souls because the spiritual life is either neglected or outright denied. Imagine a person eating only candy and junk food every single day.

We know what happens. The same thing happens in the spiritual life

when we make choices that are not good for us spiritually.

On occasion, I intentionally scroll through all the cable TV channels and notice how many of the shows are about murders, evil, and violence. Most episodes of 20/20, Dateline NBC, etc., are about human beings killing other human beings. There always seems to be some documentary about Hitler. We see shows like Very Scary People. The balance is way off.

What we take into our ears and eyes matters as much to our overall health as what we eat and drink. Please note, Fr. Bob isn't a total prude, but it's important for each of us to watch our intake balance. The bad news must be balanced by the good news.

Jesus' question is meant to prod us and to make us think. What are we truly looking for? And what or who can fill the God-shaped hole in our respective hearts. We need light in our lives.

Ponder this: Jesus, the one who asks the question, is the ultimate Answer.

He is the way, and the truth, and the life. When we finally realize He is our everything, then we'll have arrived at 4 P.M., which is the time of day it was when the two disciples in our Gospel made the decision to stay with Christ. What are YOU looking for? Bring this to prayer today.

As the congregation sits down following the General Intercessions, the Mass pivots from the Liturgy of the Word to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Practically, the gifts of bread and wine are brought to the priest, ideally by the people, and a collection is taken up.

The priest receives these gifts, and along with the deacon and altar servers, prepares the altar for the consecration of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Meanwhile, the choir sings a hymn to accompany the preparation.

But the offertory is much more than just ensuring the bread and wine are placed on the altar and that the missal is open to the right page. As I've written in previous articles, the Mass is a sacrifice not just by the priest.

Rather, we unite our own offerings and sacrifices along with the bread and the wine. Remember what the priest says once the bread and wine are on the altar? "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice <u>and yours</u> may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father."

One of my teachers in seminary

# FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

explained to us how he taught his own children to add their offerings to the altar. He had them bring to mind whatever they wanted to give to God that day from their own heart. Maybe it was a family member or friend who was sick. Maybe it was the joy of a new experience. Maybe it was a powerful emotion or desire.

Whatever it was, he had them hold it in their heart and then "throw" it onto the altar next to the bread and wine and see it sitting on the paten or in the chalice.

When we offer these sacrifices, we shouldn't think that it is just giving something up. Instead, it's better to use the language of transformation. We want God to transform these good things into something even better and more in union with God himself. It is about what is behind the offering as it comes forth from the depth of our hearts.

We can think of the chalice as a "stewpot" of the offerings, intentions, and sacrifices of the entire community. That is the beauty of the communal nature of the sacrifice of the Mass. It's joy, suffering, thanksgiving, and pleading all mixed in together so that it can be offered to God with the bread and the wine that becomes the Body and Blood. This is the sacrifice we know is acceptable by the Father.

Even the money we give back to the church can be seen in the scope of this offering from the heart. We desire to support the work of the church in her ministry and work with the poor. This desire speaks of communion with others and the evangelization of the people in our local community. St. Justin Martyr wrote about this in 170 AD: "Those who are well off, and who are also willing, give as each chooses. What is gathered is given to him who presides to assist orphans and widows, those whom illness or any other cause has deprived of resources, prisoners, immigrants and, in a word, all who are in need."

Every offering is giving some part of ourselves over to God in the hopes that someday, we can offer our whole selves to the Lord, holding nothing back from complete and total union.

There is truly only one sacrifice offered at the Mass – Jesus Christ. What we are doing is participating in the sacrifice of Jesus to God the Father.

Our offerings are made all the more powerful because they are united to that of Christ's. Come to Mass each time with what you desire to give or notice what stirs up within you during the Liturgy of the Word. That is the offering the Lord wishes you to join to his.
