There has been a meme floating around social media that says, "Science flies you to the moon. Religion flies you into buildings."

The meme is popular among the atheistic crowd, and it's not meant to be funny, but to make the point that science has the answers and religion is the problem.

The Church has been quite clear through the centuries that there need not be a division between faith and reason; that there need not be an either/or approach.

John Paul II expressed well the Church's view when he wrote, "Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth -- in a word, to know himself – so that by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves." (Fides et Ratio).

So, what's wrong with the world? Science? Religion? "Them?"

This question reminds me of the request made to G. K. Chesterton by a London periodical. The editors asked Mr. Chesterton to write an essay that answers the question, "What is wrong with the world?"

He wrote back, "Dear sirs, I am. Sincerely, G. K. Chesterton."

# FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG

Chesterton's witty reply should remind us of the terrible residual effects of The Fall. Something serious happened to the human condition. Things are not as they should be. Our faith tradition calls this event Original Sin. We lost grace. All of humanity has been affected.

The English word religion emerges from the Latin word religare, which means "to bind back; to connect." The authentic purpose of religion is to bind back heaven and earth, divinity and humanity. This is the purpose of the Incarnation; God taking to Himself human flesh; to redeem us in the Person of Jesus, the Christ.

In the Son of God and Son of Man, we find our salvation. The healing has begun. Intimacy is being restored between God and man. Jesus is the Mediator. We have access to GRACE, and this grace begins in the waters of baptism, when the stain of original sin is washed away. We receive the Holy Spirit and sanctifying grace, we become adopted children of God the Father, and we join the Christian family.

All of this is possible because of the Paschal Mystery, which is the suffering, death, resurrection and ascension of Christ. His blood shed for our salvation becomes the eternal antidote to sin, evil, and death. Jesus says, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life."

Friends, science can be corrupted by human beings as easily as we can corrupt religion. Just because we call something "religion" does not mean it should immediately receive God's seal of approval. And just because we say "science" does not mean truth is automatically involved. The common denominator in the corruption of both science and religion is the reality of evil and human cooperation with evil. This human cooperation with evil can be devastating, as history has shown us. Human beings are capable of heroic virtue, but we're also capable of

demonic terror. The freewill choices we make matter.

Jesus says, "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but underneath are ravenous wolves. By their fruits you will know them." (MT 7: 15-16).

The fruits of flying airplanes into skyscrapers are NOT OF GOD. The fruits of sexually abusing children are NOT OF GOD. The saints of the Church model for us heroic virtue, as do the men and women who risked their lives helping save lives on September 11, 2001.

Cooperation with evil planned the events of 9/11 and carried them out. God knows who orchestrated it all. Cooperation with grace showed up in all the human beings who risked their own lives to save lives; mirroring in a human way what Jesus did for all of humanity on the cross. "This is My Body given up for you." Why? Love, which is willing the good of the other, as other. (St. Thomas Aquinas).

Mary, mother of Mercy, pray for us.

purpose. At least two candles are required, with more candles being added for higher feast and solemnities. When the ordinary of the diocese (non-auxiliary bishop) is present, seven altar candles are used.

The hosts are held in a special dish called a ciborium, which can have flat bottoms or stems. These vessels are always made and line with precious metals, such as gold or silver, since they come in contact with the consecrated Body of Christ. They are blessed by a bishop or priest prior to being used for liturgy. Typically, extra consecrated hosts are kept in a covered ciborium within the tabernacle.


For the precious Blood, a chalice is used. Like the ciborium, it must be made and lined with precious metals because it touches the sacred species. It is a tradition that every priest receives a chalice at his ordination, usually from his parents or other close family members. Prior to the ordination, the bishop blesses the chalices (you can see me holding mine below shortly following this blessing).

Chalices come in a variety of styles and are often engraved with images of the Holy Family, saints, holy words, or scenes from the life of Christ. The chalice base can be engraved with the names of those who donated it or names to hold in memorial. Mine has my parents' names and my ordination date. Within the base, I had the wedding rings of both my grandfathers welded in place. With a chalice comes a paten, which is the flat dish the big celebrant host is place on.

Any priest can bless a chalice and paten during a Mass prior to the offertory using these words: "With joy, Lord God, we place on your altar this chalice and paten for the celebration of the sacrifice of the new covenant. May the Body and Blood of your Son, offered and received by means of these vessels, make them holy. Grant, we pray, O Lord, that, celebrating the unblemished sacrifice, we may be renewed by your Sacraments on earth and endowed with your Spirit, until with the Saints we come to delight in your banquet in the Kingdom of Heaven."

Once wine has been poured into the chalice, the priest covers it with a pall. This is a stiff square that protects the contents of the chalice from things falling in, like dust or bugs. The ciboria, chalice, and paten are placed on a cloth called a corporal, which helps to contain any fragments or small spills.

Traditionally, the fabric is linen, the same which wrapped the body of the Lord in the tomb. A purificator is used to wipe the chalice after the Blood is consumed and when the vessels are purified after the distribution of communion. All these linens are washed in a special sink called a sacrarium that drains directly into the ground. We wouldn't want the remnants of the Body and Blood of Christ to be mixed with sewage.



These special items are consecrated, that is, set apart for a special purpose. Just as a priest is set apart at his ordination for performing the sacraments in the person of Jesus Christ and the Christian faithful are set apart at baptism to be God's people, objects are set apart to be used only for Mass. They all have some sort of practical purpose, but because they are used for serving God, they also have a spiritual or theological purpose.

You'll notice that candles are lit for Mass, often placed next to the altar and processed by the servers for the Gospel. As the Light of the World, Christ can be seen in the candle's flame. While it is no longer a requirement, candles used for Mass once had to be made out of beeswax. It symbolized the flesh Christ received from his Mother, Mary, the wick his soul, and the flame his divinity. It also represented taking something ordered and made by nature and elevating it for a higher




