



The English word love gets tossed around rather easily these days.

We say that we love vacations, or we love chocolate, or we love our favorite baseball team. And oh, we love our spouse/family. Are these all the same kind of love? We hope not.

The love Jesus talks about in this Sunday's gospel is much deeper than vacations, chocolate, and the Cubs/ White Sox. The love Jesus mentions is the Greek word "agape." In Greek, there are four different words for love: storge, philia, eros, and agape.

If you are interested in taking a deeper dive into these four loves, C.S. Lewis wrote a book titled *The Four Loves*. He goes into detail in his unique style of prose.

So, what is agape? From a Catholic perspective, we'd say that agape was used by Christ to describe the love among the persons of the Holy Trinity, but it is also the love he commanded his followers to have for one another. It is totally selfless love, which seeks not one's own advantage but only to benefit or share with another.

St. Thomas Aquinas taught that love is willing the good of the other, as other. This is a love that desires the good of another. There are no strings attached and no manipulation. Agape gets out of oneself for the good of

someone else. Agape is other focused.

Jesus says into today's Gospel, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you should also love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Notice how Jesus calls it a commandment; not a polite suggestion. What Jesus is saying here is life changing and world changing. And yet, we know the struggle of not being able to love as Jesus loves. The good news is that the Lord provides the grace we need to love this way. To think we can love as Jesus loves without Jesus is folly. We need the Lord so that He can love in and through us. We become instruments of His love, thanks be to God.

The more a society becomes Godless, the more individualistic and selfish it risks becoming. A Godless society loses sight of the Love (God) that unites all human beings. We can see evidence of this individualism and selfishness in our current culture as folks twist freedom to the point it means freedom from God's love and God's law. Or we see the name of God hijacked by human beings and God's name used to justify evil acts.

The less we're guided by Love (capital L), the less we are willing to sacrifice for others. We risk becoming more "me" centered rather than "we" centered. Agape is a self-sacrificing love. If we need concrete evidence, we need look no further than the Cross. Jesus on the Cross is the ultimate act of self-sacrifice that wills the good of the other — our salvation. Those outstretched arms on Calvary speak to us through the centuries, saying "I love you this much."

Faith becomes our response to God's agape, and faith looks like something. Faith is not abstract. Faith is prayer, worship, and service. We love God so that we can love others. We love others because we love God. It's all connected. The saints are wonderful models of agape. The Blessed Mother is a wonderful model of agape. And of course, Jesus is our model par excellence.

At any given moment on any given day, we are moving one of two directions: toward Love (God) or away from Love (God). There is no neutral zone. The words we speak and the actions we do are either in the service of Love or they are not. May the good Lord help us to be more intentional in what we say and what we do. Even when we might have to offer some constructive feedback, we can do so from a place of love; which means wanting what is best for another.

We don't do this on our own power. It's the power of God working in and through us.

As we continue to get swept up in the excitement and zeal of a Chicagoan as pope, I want to share a youth program that we'll be bringing to Two Holy Martyrs this summer. Given its fidelity to Catholic teaching, Marian devotion, and communal fun, I'm sure our own Pope Leo XIV would fully endorse it.

The program is called "Totus Tuus" and has been hosted at parishes in the Archdiocese of Chicago for almost 20 years. Our parish hosted it a few summers ago, and it will make its return this summer the week of July 6th to 11th. While it is primarily aimed at helping our young disciples understand living as a Catholic, it involves the entire parish in ensuring we have a successful week of faith and fun.

Totus Tuus is a Latin phrase that means "Totally yours", and it comes from Pope St. John Paul's papal motto. At its heart, it signifies our desire to give ourselves entirely to Jesus Christ through his Blessed Mother Mary. It also speaks to the effort of the missionaries to give their whole selves to every young person during the summer.

Each missionary team consists of 4 college students and seminarians who desire to share their own love of the Lord. After a few weeks of intense formation, these teams of two men and two women are sent out to a different parish every week for six weeks. Within the parish, they

conduct a week-long parish mission, teaching and inspiring the youth. I personally was a TT missionary for two summers: once as a college student and once as a seminarian.

The week is split into two simultaneous programs. During the day, Monday through Friday from 9AM-2:30PM, the team hosts all kids who will be in first through sixth grade in the fall. Using skits, songs, games, and activities, the missionaries teach about a central Catholic belief along with one set of the mysteries of the rosary. This year, it's the Sacraments and the Joyful Mysteries. Mass is a part of each day at 11:15am, which is open for all parishioners throughout the week. The week ends with a big water fight and ice cream.

In the evenings starting on Sunday, kids in 7th grade through high school meet for fellowship and discussion, which includes a night of adoration and confession and a night of outdoor games. They also have the opportunity to help as aides for the day program. The missionaries stay the entire week in the parish.

So, what can you do to help for this week? First, you can sign up your kids/grandkids for the week and spread the word about the program. Costs are \$50/grade school kid and \$25/junior high or high schooler for the entire week (parents: think of the relaxation of having your kids out of the house for almost 6 hours a day for a whole week!)

Second, you can volunteer to host our missionary team for dinner or to bring them lunch. It's a unique experience to host four college-aged disciples who are on fire for their faith and love sharing the Gospel. Even if you aren't sending kids to the program, you can host the team or bring them lunch (we'll let you know any dietary restrictions).

Third, you can host our female missionaries in your home for the week. The guys will be staying at the rectory, but we need a place for our ladies to call home. If you have an extra room and bathroom and can provide the missionaries with breakfast each morning, it's another great experience to get to know young disciples of Jesus. You can also help our missionaries during the day, especially with check-in, snack setup, at lunch/recess, and clean-up. Please email me at kgregus@archchicago.org if you would like to volunteer to host/ deliver a meal, host the missionaries, or help during the day.

Finally, you can pray for the success of the program, both at our parish and across the Archdiocese. It's truly an incredible experience for the missionaries, the kids, and the parishioners.

Registration information and flyers will be coming soon, so keep a lookout in the bulletin, on the parish website, and in Mass announcements. I cannot overstate how much I love Totus Tuus and how it ignites the faith life of all who participate. Being a missionary was a key part of my discernment to the priesthood, and I'm thrilled we are hosting it this summer.


