In last week's bulletin for Easter Sunday, the theme here was grace and gratitude. Let's continue this theme into the Second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

We spend weeks rejoicing and pondering the significance of Jesus' suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension and how we each play our part in the story of salvation. We must cooperate with God's grace.

Allow me this week to express my gratitude. Thank you!

In a special way, I want to thank the folks who helped decorate our two beautiful churches. The church doesn't decorate itself. We have parishioners who give the time and talent to get our churches ready for our various seasons.

I also want to highlight our choir under the direction of David Boyle.

The choir practices regularly. They are 100 percent volunteers. They love to lead us in song. They were present on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and the 9 AM Mass on Easter morning. Thank you!

During Lent, we also had a committed group of parishioners who did the hard work of offering the Friday Fish Fry every other week. These folks do the setup, execution, and clean up for this fundraiser that also helps people abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent.

Please allow me to also thank our parish staff. The staff does the daily X's and O's that too often go

Usher, Usher, Usher

In the coming weeks and months, we want to get our parish usher/hospitality ministry more formalized. Our years of COVID protocol caused us to have to adapt some things here and there.

We've also seen some folks step away from ministry.

We've had a group of loyal folks keep us going over the past few years to ensure our collection baskets get around and people make their way forward for communion in an orderly fashion.

These folks also make sure to assist anyone who enters our church who has a need.

Ideally, we'd love to have a generous number of volunteers at each of our five (5) parish Masses.

We especially need help right now with our Noon Mass.

The goal is to get enough volunteers at each Mass so that the same people don't have to be an usher every Sunday.

If this is something you feel called to, please bring it to prayer, and then call the parish office and offer your name and contact info. Tell one of the office staff members that you want to be put on the usher volunteer list, and let the staff member know what Mass you'd be willing to help be an usher. A hospitality/usher captain will reach out to you.

Divine Mercy Sunday

This is Divine Mercy Sunday, the Second Sunday of the Easter season.

After the Noon Mass, Fr. Kevin Gregus, our associate pastor, will lead the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

This is a powerful devotion, and we want to offer the chaplet on this day. Please consider joining us in prayer.

We can expect the Chaplet of Divine Mercy to begin no later than 1:15 PM in our St. Symphorosa church.

We need to let the Noon Mass conclude and allow folks to depart after Mass before the chaplet begins. Thank you!

As we end this octave of Easter, I want to go back to the Easter Vigil Mass. As I mentioned, part of that liturgy is the Exultet, or the Easter Proclamation. It is chanted after the lit Paschal Candle is brought into the church and placed in its stand in the sanctuary. All the faithful hold candles that have been lit by the flame of the Paschal Candle.

The Exultet is probably my favorite prayer in all of the Church's liturgies.

Let me explain why.

It is proclaimed just after the singular light of the Paschal Candle is brought into the dark church, as our risen Lord enters among his people after his burial and the harrowing of hell. Just the sight of that light amidst the darkness spurs all who see it to the hope that can only be provided by our savior Jesus Christ.

The chant begins by calling up the angels and armies of heaven to exult and rejoice at the Lord's great triumph. It calls upon all the earth to be glad as the light of Christ extends to every part of the world.

Finally, it calls upon our mother, the Church, to rejoice and for our very church gathered to "shake with joy, filled with the mighty voices of the peoples."

We then dive into salvation history, getting a taste of what we will hear in all the Easter Vigil readings from the Old Testament. The Triduum we celebrate is intimately linked to the creation and fall of Adam and Eve, the Passover, the Exodus, and the prophets. In our remembrance, we are brought back to those moments of God saving his people through real and material ways.

The pillar of fire in the desert now becomes the Paschal Candle that brings the light of Christ.

"This is the night that even now, throughout the world, sets Christian believers apart from worldly vices and from the gloom of sin, leading them to grace and joining them to his holy ones." The Church joins as one as we celebrate what differentiates us from the rest of the world – belief in a savior who has died for us and rose victoriously.

There is one line that gives me chills every time due to its stark truth and deep beauty: "O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ! O happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!" Isn't that incredible? We are actually thanking God for the fall of man because it was the means by which God the Son would come to earth to live among us as one of us, to talk our talk, walk our walk, and die our death so as to rise triumphantly over sin and death.

The praises sung of the candle itself speak of the harmony between man and the rest of creation that was thrown out of whack by the fall. "On this, your night of grace, O holy Father, accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of your servants' hands, an evening sacrifice of praise, this gift from your most holy Church." God ordained bees to create wax that can give light when taken and fashioned into candles. This wax feeds the flame so that the fire can remain and be spread.

Every Mass, but especially the Triduum and Easter, are the closest heaven and earth get. "O truly blessed night, when things of heaven are wed to those of earth, and divine to the human." This is done perfectly in Christ, which he extends though his Church, her sacraments, her liturgies, and through the communal celebration of the Body of Christ.






