Keep it simple, silly.

Sometimes we humans like to make things sound more complex than they need to be, or we use fancy polysyllabic words (like polysyllabic; which means more than one syllable) when more digestible words could have been used to express an idea.

This comes to mind when parish leaders need to sit through meetings about vision statements and mission statements. How tempting it is to come up with something that sounds polished and corporate, but no one really knows what it means.

Keeping this in mind, here is statement simplicity: the vision statement of every Christian church should be the Beatific Vision (you and I forever in the presence of the Holy Trinity; A.K.A. God). The mission statement of every Christian church should be that we are a place on earth where saints are made.

Certainly, I'm being a little tongue in cheek, but not by much. We should never lose sight of the fact that the Lord has given us the Church as the way of sanctification for humanity. Jesus gives us everything we need to be holy. He summons us all to conform our lives to him, and he gives us the grace to make this a reality. This is why the seven sacraments of the Church are so vitally important.

Resting atop all the sacraments is the Eucharist. What is the Eucharist in the Catholic Church? It is everything. It is Christ himself in the Real Presence. This is Jesus; Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity.

There is no more intimate way to encounter Jesus on earth than in the Blessed Sacrament.

At every celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, ordinary bread and wine are brought forth as gifts from the people of God. On the altar, by way of a validly ordained priest who stands in the Person of Christ, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.

We are truly blessed to receive the Eucharist during the Communion Rite at Holy Mass. We are NOT receiving a piece of bread. We receive the Lord Himself when we reverently receive the Eucharist. It's not a symbol. It is Christ.

St. Angela of Foligno wrote, "If we but paused for a moment to consider attentively what takes place in this sacrament, I am sure that the thought of Christ's love for us would transform the coldness of our hearts into a fire of love and gratitude."

All the canonized saints of the Church understood the importance of the Eucharist. Everything else flows from and returns to this amazing mysterious sacrament. The Eucharist truly is the source and summit of our faith.

There is a universal call to holiness for all God's children. We are called to be saints. Our vision and our mission must be Eucharistic. The Lord gave us the Church so we could receive through her what we as humans need to grow closer and closer to Christ.

And in growing closer to Jesus, we find ourselves growing closer to one another.

One way to think of Christians is that we are a people on the move. We recognize that we are on earth as pilgrims journeying to our true home in the kingdom of God. Often, we sense that this world isn't our permanent home as we restlessly move from one activity or lifestyle to another.

The liturgy picks up on this human intuition and orients it in the proper direction. You'll notice throughout the Mass that there are a number of processions.

The priest, altar servers, and other ministers process into the sanctuary at the beginning of Mass. There is a procession with candles and the book of the Gospels as we await the proclamation of the Good News.

There is a procession of the gifts of bread and wine as the people present the priest with the matter that will be transformed by God into the Body and Blood

of Jesus (yes, this has become a casualty of COVID at many of our Masses).

There is a procession of the people to receive the Eucharist. There is a procession out of the sanctuary after the dismissal as we move into the world rejuvenated by word and sacrament. All of these processions are typically accompanied by music.

These are no accident or mere show. The processions at each liturgy reflect how we are people on a journey. In many ways, it makes us like the Israelites in the desert, slowly moving toward the promised land in the presence of God in the Ark of the Covenant after moving through the Red Sea to freedom.

As they went along, the Israelites moved with dispositions of repentance, thanksgiving, adoration, and petition.

So, these gestures are meant to symbolize an inward truth via a visible action. It can be easy to forget that we are meant to continue moving toward our true home in heaven, always preparing to be fully united with God by giving ourselves to him every day.

This doesn't mean we forget to live in the present because we are focused on the future.
Rather, we engage in actions that help us to be better attuned

to God in our pasts, presents, and futures.

Sometimes, we participate in processions to celebrate major feast days in the Church year, such as Corpus Christi. We process with our Lord in the Eucharist in a public manner. As we are walking along with the true presence of Jesus Christ, we show the world what we are about – we are people made to be with our God eternally. As God's chosen people, we worship him in song and prayer as we move along with him.

Another popular procession is the Stations of the Cross in which we journey with Jesus as he suffers under the weight of the cross and dies to redeem us. There is something about moving along with Jesus both physically and mentally that allows us to more fully be in union with Jesus.

Our processions at Mass help us remember that we move with purpose as we strive to live holiness. It's when we stop and stagnate that we find ourselves languishing and wondering where God is

Instead, we process in a specific time and at a specific place to show that we are returning to the God who has given us everything so that we can live with him eternally.



The W's and How's of SPRED...

WHAT is SPRED?

SPRED (Special Religious Development) is a program which trains and guides parishes to provide faith formation to persons with developmental disabilities and/or learning problems and become integrated into parish life.

WHO is served by SPRED? SPRED serves children and adults with various developmental and cognitive disabilities such as Down's Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy, anyone in the Autism Spectrum, seizure disorders, learning disabilities, etc. Participation starts at the age of 6 and may continue throughout adulthood.

HOW can faith be nourished in those with developmental disabilities?

A relationship with God is accessible to all. Friendship is the human experience closest to understanding the presence of God in life. By calling to mind life experiences, sharing these experiences in a circle of friendship, the small community of faith becomes aware of the sacredness of all life and then returns to life changed.

WHY SPRED?

In **SPRED**, each person is partnered with a catechist, a model of faith and friendship. As trust is established and friendship deepens, we all become aware of our place in the family of God and celebrate it in our community of faith that extends to the greater parish community.

WILL my son or daughter or the person in my care participate liturgically and sacramentally in the church?

Sacraments and liturgy are a right of all people and are accessible to all. Participation in a **SPRED** community helps to facilitate readiness to enjoy the Sacraments with reverence and a new awareness.

HOW can I or my child participate in the SPRED program? Contact the Two Holy Martyrs SPRED Chairperson, Ann Smolucha at 773-914-1900 or ann@smolucha.com to facilitate placement.
