Those close to me know I am a thrifter. I regularly peruse the aisles of thrift stores looking for hidden gems. The old Bohemian in me shows. I've had my share of "finds."

However, the other day as I stood in the check-out line, I looked up at the wall and noticed the four categories that the Salvation Army proudly displays: Mission Statement, Finding Treasure, When You Give, and Changing Lives.

This was the gem I needed because it also reminds us of WHY the Church exists, and WHY the parish is so important no matter where in the world the parish exists, including the Clearing and Garfield Ridge communities in the City of Chicago.

Mission Statement: Let's avoid the corporate buzzwords. When it comes to the Church, we know the mission comes to us from Jesus: to proclaim the Gospel, which is the good news of salvation. The Church is the sacrament of salvation. She exists to make saints. She exists as the avenue of sanctification in this world. We are called to BE disciples, and to MAKE disciples. When other things in the Church or in parish life become more important than the gospel, then we know we've lost sight of the mission. If we need a short, powerful mission statement, then we need look no further than Jesus. He summed it quite succinctly: Love God. Love neighbor.

Finding Treasure: In chapter six of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus says "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and decay destroy, and thieves break in and steal. But store up treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor decay destroys, nor thieves break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be."

Is Jesus your treasure? He is the way, and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Him. Jesus helps us along the way by giving us the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church which are avenues of

grace for our spiritual well-being. The Eucharist is a treasure.

Far too often we lose sight of the things of heaven and begin solely living for the material things of this world, which will crumble and decay. This crumble and decay include the buildings of the institutional church. The cathedrals will crumble. Our faith, however, is not in buildings. Our faith is in a Person, and that Person is Jesus, the Christ.

When You Give: In the Church, we call this Stewardship. In some Christian denominations, it's called tithing. Being an intentional disciple of Jesus means being a good steward of our gifts. While the Church provides the means of salvation for us, we in turn help provide for the Church. Closer to home, the parish provides the means of salvation (Sharing the Gospel, teaching the faith, providing access to the sacraments). We, in turn, provide for the parish by way of the Three T's: time, treasure, talent.

Time is the way in which we volunteer. We say, "How can I give of my time for the good of the parish?" Time is valuable, and we are grateful for all those who give their time.

Treasure is the way in which we give financially to the parish. Every parishioner is called to give financially as best we can. Some folks honestly think the parish is sitting on a boat-load of cash. Truth? We are not. Please give as best you are able to support Two Holy Martyrs.

Talent is the way we can share our gifts in service to the universal Church and to the parish. We really do have a lot of talented people who share what God has given them with the Church God has given all of us. This is a beautiful thing. Talent comes in many forms: music, art, legal skills, finance skills, coaching skills, decorating skills, cooking skills, teaching skills. The list could go on and on.

Everything the Lord has given us as individuals can be used for the Church, and for the greater glory of God.

Changing Lives

St. Paul writes in Galatians, chapter 2, "I have been crucified with Christ; yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me." Before he became Paul, he was Saul, and he was a vehement persecutor of the Church. He rounded up Christians for jail and worse. Then something lifechanging happened. Saul had an authentic encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus. Life would never be the same.

The mission of Christ summons people to new life. It's an invitation. Love does not coerce. Jesus interacted with people, not to leave them in their sins, but to save them and show them a better way.

He ate with sinners; not to join them in their sins but to CHANGE THEIR LIFE. Far too often we want to drag Jesus down into the mud instead of allowing Him to lift us up out of sin, evil and death into new life.


I'm still a sinner. I still stumble and fall, but I know Jesus changed my life. He changed my life on the day I was baptized, but he also changed my life when he found me at the darkest moment of my life, and I found myself in the back pews at St. Mary church in DeKalb, Illinois. He always stood ready for me. I just wasn't ready for Him. Life has a way of humbling us, and the Lord does wonders with rock bottom.

Be mindful of how Jesus has been in your life, and how you have responded to His love.

Saints were not born saints. Saints know they are sinners who stand in desperate need of God's grace. Saints respond to God's love by echoing the Blessed Mother's famous words, "I am the Lord's servant. Be it done unto me according to your word."

Jesus changes lives. Trust Him. He's been doing it for 2,000 years, and He's not finished.

As I work to get this column on its feet, I want to start with some broader concepts in order to set up a solid base camp from which we can mine the depths together.

Last week, I wrote about our primary disposition being one of receptivity. God reaches out to man, and we respond.

One of the central means of this is liturgy.

There are numerous liturgies we participate in as Catholics, with the Holy Mass being the pinnacle.

What are some others?

Confession, baptism, exposition and benediction during adoration, funerals, blessings, care of the sick, and the

liturgy of the hours, to name a few.

To put it simply, "every liturgical action ... is an encounter between Christ and the Church" [CCC 1097].

From its earliest days, which even predate the Church, liturgy was seen as a public duty or service undertaken by a citizen for the common good. So, liturgy is a work done on behalf of the people.

This "work" involves all of us and is always public in nature. It starts with God the Father and continues through the Son, Jesus Christ, and is for the people so that we may share in salvation.

However, we know from our experience with the above liturgies that we have a key role in offering these liturgies. The goal of our worship in liturgy is directed at the praise of God and the sanctification of the world.

There are five elements present in each liturgy:

- → Christological Christ as true high priest who offers and is the sacrifice; meaningless without him
- ★ Anthropological They use signs and symbols accessible to humans;

done to accomplish the salvation for man offered by God

- → Ecclesiological Whole Church participates, including communion of saints; done on behalf of entire Church
- **★** Eschatological Participation in heavenly liturgy; a foretaste of heaven
- → Trinitarian Done towards the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit

Sure, these are big theological words, but what is important is the meaning of each one.

We can keep these in mind every time we prepare for Mass or for any other liturgy God calls us to participate in the great work of salvation.

The more aware we are of the purpose of what we do, the more we can actively engage with the work of God we do together.
