This weekend we celebrate the

Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord.

Jesus has NOT gone up, up and away like a beautiful balloon or fancy spaceship, but the Son of God and Son of man has changed His mode of existence. He is with us now in and through His Church by the power of the Holy Spirit.

We sometimes get trapped thinking "Here is earth. There is heaven." It helps us, however, to consider that heaven came to earth in the Person of Jesus. John the Baptist pointed to the long-awaited Messiah when he said, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (MT 3:2).

Repent means to change; to change our minds and hearts; to turn our life around so that we surrender to God's will. Think about what we are saying when we pray the Our Father. "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

We are praying that the ways of heaven take root in the here and now. On our own power this is impossible, but with our cooperation with God's grace and power, amazing things can happen, and have happened. Heaven and earth kissed when God became man. And the Paschal Mystery of Christ (His suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension) has reconciled divinity and humanity.

"Heaven Starts Now: Becoming a Saint Day by Day." I highly recommend this book. We don't want to get caught standing and staring at the sky like the "Men of Galilee" in our first reading from Acts of the Apostles.

We live in the present moment as intentional disciples of Jesus. We live the corporeal works of mercy and the spiritual works of mercy. We pray as we go about our day living for the greater glory of God. Borrowing from Matthew Kelly, we live "holy moments." This helps us manifest heaven on earth. Sadly, we live in a time when our culture has decided to celebrate unholy moments. What can we do? Live holy moments as best we can.

One day, Jesus will come again in glory. In the meantime, we must heed the words of this Sunday's Gospel. "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations."

Why Are There Liturgical Cycles?

Question: Why Does the Church Have Different Liturgical Cycles?

Answer:

While most Catholics know that the Church Year is divided into various seasons (e.g. Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, etc.), many are unaware that the one Church Year is not like the one that follows. While the main seasons and feasts are the same from year to year, the 3-year cycle for Sundays and the 2-year cycle for weekdays means that, as a general rule, the readings in the *Lectionary* that we hear at Mass will change from year to year, helping us to have a richer encounter with Sacred Scripture. Each new cycle begins with the beginning of the liturgical year, the First Sunday of Advent.

The reasoning behind this innovation is outlined in *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, the "Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" of the Second Vatican Council: "The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word. In this way a more representative portion of the holy scriptures will be read to the people in the course of a prescribed number of years" (no. 51). This was fully achieved in 1969 when the new cycles of readings were approved by Pope Saint Paul VI.




