Before we exchange the sign of peace during Holy Mass, the priest prays the following words.

"Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles: 'Peace be with you; my peace I give you.'"

Let's take a moment and reflect. The Lord is NOT saying, "Find peace on your own." Instead, he says, "My peace I give you." The Prince of Peace is the source of authentic peace, and we must be plugged into the Source, and being "plugged in" to the Source means living in grace-filled relationship with Christ, who is the Son of God and Son of man; the Mediator between heaven and earth, and in his Person, the kingdom of heaven is at hand on earth.

The risen Christ addresses the first disciples in our Easter season gospel readings with "Peace be with you."

These early disciples were still cowered in fear. They were in fear of the religious leaders of the day and the Roman leaders. They also lived with the realization that most of them had abandoned Jesus during his time of trial. Would he come back with vengeance?

No. Jesus would not return with vengeance. Instead, he greets them, "Peace be with you." He returns as the risen Christ; his body now glorified. They are witnesses to his resurrection.

The truth of the resurrection amazes those first disciples, and it should amaze us today.

Last Monday, as I drove to Orland Park to do business, I drove during the height of the solar eclipse. What did I notice along the way? People looking up. People gathered. People getting out of themselves for a common interest.

FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG

I quickly scribbled down a homily idea on a note pad. It is the crucified and risen Jesus that is the Son who draws all humanity to himself. We're invited to look up from our purely earthly interests to the Son. We do this individually but also communally as a human race. As we gather and look to the Son, we get out of ourselves (selfishness, pride) and look toward God and toward our brothers and sisters in the light of Christ.

We recall the words of the late Trappist monk Thomas Merton. He wrote, "We are not at peace with others because we are not at peace with ourselves, and we are not at peace with ourselves because we are not at peace with God."

This means the God of human history that has slowly revealed himself in various covenants throughout salvation history; ultimately revealing himself in the Person of Jesus, the Christ. He is the long-awaited Messiah. He is the Savior of the world; ALL the world.

From John's Gospel, chapter 12 -- "Now is the judgment of this world, now shall the ruler of this world be cast out; and when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself."

Jesus on the cross of Calvary is our salvation, the "our" meaning humanity. In Christ, we find our peace. In Christ, we find communion. In him, we find life; life now and eternal life.

Christ is not just another choice in some grand religious buffet. The Lord is quite clear when he says, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father except through me."

This isn't a threat. Love me or else! It's a divine summons of love from the One who is Love.

When we honestly and truly direct our gaze to the Son, we find ourselves grower closer to one another in the same common humanity the incarnate God shares with us. We lift our heads up from purely earthly concerns and allow ourselves to be guided daily in the ordinariness of life by the Love that transcends this world; a Love that

created this world; a Love that gives us the sun and the moon.

The name of Jesus has gone out to all nations. The Church is a mission. She shares the good news of salvation all the while attending to the needs of the poor, the hungry, the imprisoned, the sick, the homeless, etc. The "Why?" of our merciful actions has a name – Jesus, the Prince of Peace. Love is alive!

Now that the Holy Week and Easter Triduum festivities have passed, we can return to our dive into the Eucharistic prayers. If you recall, the next one to discuss is EPIII. It begins with the same words as EPII, but instead of immediately calling for the descent of the Holy Spirit, it speaks of the totality of the sacrifice being offered: "You are indeed Holy, O Lord, and all you have created rightly gives you praise..."

EPIII was a new creation following the Second Vatican Council, though it borrowed from both the Roman Canon (EPI) and the anaphora of St. Hippolytus of Rome (the basis of EPII). It was intended as a "medium-length" prayer that could be used both on Sundays and weekdays.

The language of a "holy and living sacrifice" was taken from the anaphora of Theodore of Mopsuestia, a Greek theologian from the 400s.

Like EPII, it can be used with any preface. Many presiders opt for EPIII when there is a saint or martyr being honored on a memorial or feast day.

FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

This is due to an option provided in the rubrics to insert either the saint of the day or the parish's patron saint in the section about our future hope of life with the angels and saints. This is the only eucharistic prayer that allows for this insertion.


This eucharistic prayer makes great emphasis on the Holy Spirit from the very beginning: "By the power and working of the Holy Spirit, you give life to all things and make them holy." There is clear and distinct epiclesis: "Therefore, O Lord, we humbly implore you: by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts we have brought to you for consecration."

This imparts the understanding that truly all three persons of the Trinity are present at the consecration. The sacrifice of the Son is being offered to the Father in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Following the words of institution, the prayer plainly states that the offering of the eucharist in the Mass is the highest form of worship and the way in which the Lord desires his people to receive his life within them. It states: "Look, we pray, upon the oblation of your Church and, recognizing the sacrificial Victim by whose death you willed to reconcile us to yourself." We are asking God to look at our offering as the same one Jesus commanded that we offer at the Last Supper. There is clear connection between the sacrifice of and by Jesus at Calvary and in his Body and Blood present on the altar.

In the interest of the uniting action of the Holy Spirit, the prayer mentions the entire Church gathered for the sacrifice, not only the clergy: "Be pleased to confirm in faith and charity your pilgrim Church on earth, with your servant N. our Pope and N. our Bishop, the Order of Bishops, all the clergy, and the entire people you have gained for your own." It also acknowledges that the Church is truly from heaven and is on its journey to return to heaven. Our permanent home is God's Kingdom, not the passing realities of the earth.

EPIII also provides a longer option for Masses for the Dead and funerals that mentions the deceased by name and speaks of the realities of the resurrection: "Grant that he/she who was united with your Son in a death like his, may also be one with him in his Resurrection." It also calls upon the consolation of those who mourn and who hope for their own resurrection and reunification with their deceased loved ones. Paired with the language of the Church being a pilgrim, EPIII really emphasizes the heavenly direction we are meant for.


