FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG



Trust is a serious concern in our day and age. Perhaps, it's Fall.

Sometimes we just don't know who we can trust. People don't

trust our politicians. People don't trust the Church. People don't trust corporations. People don't trust the government. People don't trust our news media. We might not even trust our neighbors or someone in our own

And if we're being extra honest, there are times when we don't even trust our own self.

Let's define the word trust. Trust means a firm belief in the reliability, truth, ability, or strength of someone or something. Let's face it. People let us down at times. We let ourselves down

Our responsorial psalm on the Second Sunday of Easter gives us hope amidst earthly despair. "Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you."

This conjures up the Divine Mercy image made popular by St. Faustina Kowalska. At the bottom of the image are the words "Jesus, I trust in you." Praying those five words can be powerful. We believe to be true that Jesus is the Son of God and Son of man. This truth gives us the confidence we need to face each day mindful of God's providence.

We want to be able to trust. And there certainly are people in our respective lives that we trust. You have people you trust, and I have people I trust.

The problem, however, comes when we put our eternal trust in mortal man. We really hope the people who run our country, run our Church, run our corporations, and run our news organization will be people of integrity. People whose yes means yes, and whose no means no. Sadly, we are often our children. Many other national

disappointed.

This is a good time to visit Psalm 146:

"Praise the Lord, my soul; I will praise always been an the Lord all my life, sing praise to my issue since The God while I live. Put no trust in princes, in children of Adam powerless to save. Who breathing his last, returns to the earth; that day all his planning comes to as inconvenient or unnecessary. We nothing."

> This psalm should humble us and help us see that our fellow man is as flawed as we are, and that no human being our heart. No human being is perfect; not you, not me. Nothing can frustrate a relationship more than expecting the other person to be God for you. That's an unfair expectation for any human being. God is God. We are not.

Our Gospel this Sunday presents us with the Transfiguration. Jesus knows he's heading toward death in Jerusalem. He knows this will shock and frighten his Apostles. So, on the mountain of transfiguration, the Lord allows his divinity shine through his humanity. This will provide the hope and trust the Apostles need to move

We, too, must remember that Jesus is the Savior. He died. His is risen. This is our hope. This is the One we trust in good times and in bad times. We place our trust not in princes, but in the Prince of Peace. Jesus, we trust in you.

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

Over the course of the past 30 years, the Archdiocese of Chicago has put in place as many checks and balances as possible to help protect our children.

Each employee of the parish, and any parish volunteer working directly with children, MUST complete all necessary training and documentation required by the Archdiocese that pertains to child safety. This includes Virtus training, and for some this also includes being a Mandated Reporter.

The Archdiocese of Chicago has been at the forefront of putting into place procedures that serve to protect

There are times we encounter volunteers or potential volunteers who don't know why we require all this, or they view the whole process need everyone to please understand this is necessary so that we can nurture a healthy environment at Two Holy Martyrs Parish.

can fill the God-shaped hole we have in Our news outlets today regularly report on isolated cases of child sex abuse. These cases arise in public schools, private schools, sports organizations, scout groups, and in families. Sadly, we are all too aware of how this also happened in the Church, and that the abuse was committed by priests, as well as religious brothers and sisters. Sexual abuse of a child is not only wrong, but also cooperation with evil.

> The issue of child sex abuse is not something confined to just the Church. This is a societal problem that spans the globe. It is a topic that is uncomfortable, but it is a topic our culture must continually be aware of and address proactively. The current day issue of international child sex trafficking should be on the radar of every parent, every journalist, every elected leader, and every law enforcement official. We don't have to search 50 years in the past to find child sex abuse victims. It is going on today throughout the world. May it never happen again in this archdiocese, nor in this parish.

We continue to pray for all victims of child sex abuse. We pray for healing. We pray for justice.

In my own journey to the priesthood, before I was accepted into seminary, I had to undergo a complete background check, and I underwent a 4–5-hour psychological examination. These things were not in place 50 years ago. Once admitted, every seminarian now takes part in Virtus training, and becomes a Mandated Reporter. Each year as a priest, we cooperate with any necessary training.

FR. MATT'S REFLECTION



Lent, probably more than any other time of the year, is the liturgical season associated with Penance and Reconciliation. As you prepare for this Sacrament, the following points will facilitate a better

Confession:

- 1. Examine our consciences regularly and thoroughly; however, this examination should take place before you enter the confessional, such as by using one of the pamphlets provided in the pamphlet holders outside of the confessional. If you wait to examine your conscience until you have entered the confessional or begin looking through the pamphlet then, you might end up rushing through it or delay others from receiving the Sacrament. Being prepared for Confession is a way of loving your neighbor, your fellow Catholics, by respecting their time and desire to participate in the Sacrament
- 2. Wait our turn in line patiently.
 3. Come at the time confessions are scheduled, not a few minutes before they are to end. Additionally, you may contact a parish and arrange to meet with a priest. This option is especially helpful if you have questions or if you have not participated in the Sacrament for years.
- 4. State our sins clearly and briefly without rambling. You do not need to confess the details surrounding the sin. Priests will ask you for clarification the need it. For example, if you lied, simply state, "I lied twice." Do not add all of the circumstance about why you lied unless the priest asks for an explanation.
- 5. Confess all mortal sins in number and kind.

- 6. Confess our own sins and not someone else's, such as what a family member, friend, neighbor, or coworker did
- 7. Do not be afraid to say something "embarrassing"... just say it. Confession is meant to be healing for the soul, so offer what is shameful and evil to Christ the Divine Physician.
- 8. Do not worry that the priest will think that we are bad... he is usually impressed by our courage.
- 9. Do not fear that the priest will not keep our confession secret... he is bound by the Seal;
- 10. You do not need to confess "tendencies" or "struggles"... just sins; temptations are not sins. Remember, Jesus experienced temptation as well. He realized that Satan was tempting Him to sin and rejected these temptations; thus, He did not sin. That is the pattern for us as well.
- 11. Feelings and thoughts are not automatically sins. Recall, Jesus realized in His thoughts that Satan was tempting Him but then rejected the Devil and his temptations. If you notice a temptation with you mind, in your thoughts, and then reject it, "'Get away, Satan," (Matthew 4:10) then you have avoided the sin. Even if the feeling, such as anger or lust, or the thought, such as pride or vengeance, returns multiple times in a day, rejecting it as quickly as you can, not acting on it, avoids the sin. 12. Experiencing distraction during the Mass or your prayer is not a sin unless you voluntarily choose it. For example, while you are at Mass, beginning to think of a loved one who is ill is understandable. When you realize this concern, return your attention to the Mass and offer that person as your personal intention. There is no sin in this case. If you were to take your phone and play video games or read a novel during the Mass, that would be an intentional distraction and would be sinful.
- 13. Do not re-confess the sins, which you confessed previously. Even if the sins are part of long-standing patterns,

habits, or addiction, simply confess your sins since your last Confession. The priest will ask if he needs elaboration about your circumstances.

- 14. Similarly, do not second-guess whether you remembered to confess a particular sin from years past in a previous confession. This doubting of our previous confessions leads to a bad cycle of anxiety and constant returning to the past, placing the focus on ourselves instead of God. Accidentally forgetting to confess a sin does not mean that you were not absolved of that sin. The only sins, which are not forgiven are the ones that you intentionally withhold and do not confess, not the ones, which you accidentally forgot to include when you went to Confession years ago. The statement, "For these and any sins, which I cannot remember (or do not recall)," is intended to include those sins, which due to the imperfection of our memories, we genuinely cannot remember.
- 15. Confession is not the time for counseling, spiritual direction, examining family relations, or other conversation. All of these matters are important ones, ones which priests can discuss with you outside of the confessional. Making an appointment to meet with a priest in-person or to converse by phone will allow more time for a conversation and easier access to potential resources. An in-person meeting still allows for Confession. Even if no one else is waiting for the Sacrament when you enter the confessional, you do not who will arrive after you, also desiring Confession. 16. Remember that priests must go to confession too ... they know what we are going through.






