

There is a story of a mother helping her young daughter learn her catechism. At one point, mom tells her child about the universal call to holiness and how we are all called to be saints.

A slightly sour face came upon the girl. Mom looked at her and asked, "What's wrong, darling?" The girl responded, "But I don't want to be a statue."

We can chuckle at this cute story, but it does reveal how we can begin to perceive the canonized saints of the Church; that they were always overly pious and overly stoic marble people who lacked joy.

However, saints are people filled with joy, even when enduring life's hardships and challenges, because saints trust in the truth of Christ's suffering, death, resurrection and ascension (Paschal Mystery).

This Friday (November 1) is the Solemnity of All Saints, and this year it is a Holy Day of Obligation. Here at Two Holy Martyrs Parish, Mass will be celebrated at 8 AM in our St. Rene church, and at 7 PM in our St. Symphorosa Church.

We certainly honor and venerate all the canonized saints of the Church, but we also honor and venerate all those saints who are not officially canonized but are saints, nonetheless. It is also a day to remind ourselves we, too, are called to be saints; to remember the universal

call to holiness.

The Lord has given us the Church on earth for two main reasons: for the salvation of souls and for the sanctification of the people. We should never forget this as we make our pilgrim way Home.

French Catholic novelist Leon Bloy wrote, "The only real sadness, the only real failure, the only great tragedy in life, is not to become a saint."

And yet, we can sometimes slip into the distorted view of the little girl from our statue story and think all this salvation and holiness stuff is boring. Prayer is boring. Mass is boring. Sacred Scripture is boring, and God is boring, and then we go looking for love in all the wrong places.

The good Lord has given us everything in His Church as a blessing. It should not be seen as a burden or as boring. We need grace and God has given us the means to receive grace in and through His Church. The Holy Spirit is at work, whether we realize it or not. Our hearts need to be receptive to authentic love.

A life of sin ultimately makes us sad. Trust me! A life of grace makes us joyful. It does not mean life suddenly becomes problem free or without struggle, but we can face these problems and struggles in faith, hope, and love.

St. Teresa of Calcutta reminds us, "Saints are sinners who keep trying."

Do we fall along the way? Yup! We make mistakes. We choose wrongly, at times, but we get back up, ask for the Lord's forgiveness, and keep on keepin' on in the life of faith. We keep our spiritual eyes fixed on Christ; He who is the way, and the truth, and the life.

The promise of Christ is life (the Greek word zoe); and this is more than mere biological life. Jesus desires us to share in His divine life with us. This is grace. We must receive it and cooperate with it as we do our part to build the kingdom of God on earth until the day the Lord brings everything to fulfillment, and those whose hearts are surrendered to the Sacred Heart of Jesus shall share in God's eternal glory.

Not Feeling Well?

This is simply a loving reminder that being ill is a completely valid reason to excuse yourself from participating in person at Sunday Mass.

If you have the flu, a bad cold, a constant cough/sneeze, then prudence encourages us to rest. Sometimes people think they must be at Mass even if they are seriously sick and possibly contagious. The Church encourages us to attend to our physical health.

If you are sick and unable to participate in Holy Mass, there are some television options, and possibly still some livestream Masses. If not, please spend time in prayer and read the readings of the day (can be found at USCCB.org). The Lord knows you are ill. Jesus is with you, and the community looks forward to your return.

FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

God's existence is something that can be deduced and reasoned just by looking at the world around us.

St. Thomas Aquinas put forth five arguments that God exists just by observing the nature of the universe using our sense experience.

For example, he saw that everything must be caused by something else, such as parents causing children or a push causing an object to move. But, there must have been some first cause because there can't be an infinite chain of causes. We call this first cause "God". This observation

and reasoning can all be done by

humanity alone.

What humanity can't reason on its own, however, is that God is a Triune God. No amount of observing the world would lead us to the knowledge of the Trinity, that God is three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This required God to reveal it to us, primarily through the Incarnation and Jesus coming to dwell among us. He told us that he was the Son of God and that he was sent by his Father to accomplish the mission of redeeming humanity. He also told us that he would send his Holy Spirit to remain with us as an advocate and guide.

In the creed, we state that we first believe in "God, the Father almighty". This is the first acknowledgement of the Trinity. United in essence, nature, and substance, the persons of the

Trinity are distinguished in their relationships. God is love, and perfect love at that. For love to be perfect, a person must love someone equal in dignity and perfection and that love is perfectly reciprocated. One way of looking at the Trinity is in light of giving and receiving love. You'll notice that the names of the Trinity are relational, as you can't have a father without a son.

The Father is the source of love, giving love freely and completely without demanding it in return. This doesn't mean that the Father created the Son and the Spirit, but that from all time, he has been giving love that the Son receives, and then the Father and the Son jointly love the Spirit. Humanity, through Jesus, receives the love of the Father in as full a way as we are able. This love is revealed by God in time and space so that we can experience it. We see the love, goodness, and generativity of the Father lived in the actions of Jesus in his mission. Much of the creed is dedicated to clarifying the equality of the Father and Son while maintaining the truth that the Father is the uncreated source.

Now, we know that outside of the Incarnation, God is not material; he has no body and thus, no gender. So, why do we use the term "Father" when God also demonstrates some motherly qualities? One, "Father" is how Jesus reveals him over and over in scripture. Two, the nature of God giving love is analogous to how a father gives love and a mother receives love.

Calling God Father in no way prioritizes one gender over the other. We know from Genesis that God created humanity in his image, "male and female he created them" (Gen 1:27). The complementarity of men

and women reveals the fullness of who God is. So, we can confidently hear from God something like, "As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you" (Is 66:13), and still call God Father as revealed to us by the Son. In many ways, we are limited by language, which I will explain more in the next column.

This is one of the truly unique aspects of Christianity – we can call on God as Father. He is not distant, nor merely a creator or judge. He is the perfect Father from whom the whole concept of fatherhood flows. Even if we received less than we should have from our own biological fathers, we have a Father who is a provider, a protector, and a merciful giver. Through Jesus, we can receive the inheritance due to a child. In faith, looking to God as Father recognizes that he is at once the transcendent source of all things who is also intimately present to supply kind and compassionate care for all his children.


