FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG



Odds are you've made some poor decisions in your life. I know I certainly have before and likely will make poor decisions in the future. Life, when you think about it, is a series

of choices we make. From the time we wake up in the morning until we go to bed at night, we're consistently MAKING CHOICES.

God has given human beings the gift of freewill. This means we can choose THIS or we can choose THAT. Without freewill, we'd be more like robots than flesh and blood humans. We are not automatons. We are made in the image and likeness of God, and this means we can know, and we can love.

Our first reading this Sunday invites us to ponder our ability to choose. "Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him." (Sirach 15).

How quickly we realize what a great responsibility it is to have freewill, and how often we see evidence of this gift being abused by wrongdoing. We can sit down and watch the daily news and witness the numerous ways some of our fellow human beings have chosen murder, theft, and adultery.

In fairness to balance, good deeds take place every day all over the planet. Good deeds, however, seldom make their way into newspaper headlines. The good you do today within your family or in the workplace isn't seen by the majority but watch out if you do something wrong.

This reminds me of the example used to define what is news. Dog bites man? Not news. Man bites dog? Now that's

news.

Nobody rushes out of their house to watch someone give money to a homeless man, but we all rush out of our homes when eight Chicago Police SUVs show up on the block with their blue lights on. You get the picture.

God is always summoning us to choose wisely. The Lord doesn't leave us alone to try to figure it all out. He has given us His love and His law. We ignore God's love and law at our own peril. But we are free to choose against God. Love does not coerce. Love becomes a choice. We can choose God's way or choose to walk the other way. Our choices move us closer to Love, or our choices can distance us from Love.

Everything Jesus gives us in and through His Church is for our good; not just as individuals but as a human race: the Commandments, the Beatitudes, prayer, Sacred Scripture, Sacraments, works of mercy are all grace-filled "helps" for us along our pilgrim way. Life in Christ gives us strength and courage to made good choices; wise choices.

A good question for each one of us before we say or do something is to ask, "Is what I am about to say coming from a place of love?" Or, "Is what I am about to do a loving act?" If the answer to either question is no, then we need to take a closer look at why we're saying it, or why we are doing it.

The Holy Spirit guides us in truth and in love, and the Holy Spirit helps us make our choices. We are not alone. The Father has given us an Advocate, a Counselor. Yup, the Holy Spirit. Come, Holy Spirit, come.

JESUS AS SAVIOR

G.K. Chesterton was a wonderfully humorous man. He'd make his readers laugh all the while making a good point.

He certainly did that when he wrote, "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting; it has been found difficult and left untried."

Following Jesus is not the easy road in this life. Life in Christ involves the cross, and the reality of the cross can make us pull back. However, the cross is truly the portal to new life. Nothing worth anything of value is easy in this life. A jigsaw puzzle doesn't put itself together by us wishing it done. Instead, we must sit down, roll up our sleeves, and put the puzzle together.

There is a sense of accomplishment when the final picture is revealed.

Being a Christian has never been easy. For some reason, the truth of Jesus and the message of the good news of salvation is not welcome in some circles. We cannot allow ourselves to get discouraged or timid. We run the race. We keep the faith. We keep our eyes fixed on Jesus as we go about our daily life.

Along the way, we experience a peace that the world cannot give. We experience joy from being in relationship with Christ. We carry the cross knowing that through the cross is the promise of Eternal Life.

Now is not the time to cut and run. Now is the time to lean into our faith even more.

Believe it or not, the season of Lent is right around the corner. Ash Wednesday is February 22, 2023. This is a wonderful time of year to get back to basics. This is a great time to "get right" with God. It is our penitential season of praying, fasting and almsgiving.

Jesus is at work, and he is at work in and through each of us. May we be inspired by this Lent to learn more about our faith, and to grow closer to the Lord so that we can grow closer to one another.






