One of the main obstacles people say keeps them from belief in God is the reality of evil.

They look at the world and see evidence of man's inhumanity to man and say, "How could a good and loving God allow this to happen?"

In all honesty, that's a fair question; one that our Judeo-Christian faith has wrestled with for thousands of years. Who among us hasn't witnessed an event in the news or in our personal lives that makes us shout, "That is so evil. Why?"

This topic of evil could fill volumes of heady theological books as the author dives into the story of creation, the Fall, Original Sin, spiritual death, physical death, and salvation through the suffering, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus. We do not have the space for that in this bulletin.

Please note, however, that as we think about evil, there is a part of us that recognizes evil as evil and recognizes how things SHOULD BE.

Where does the 'should be" come from? Who or what is the standard of "should be" or "ought to be?" Our first reading this Sunday is from the Book of Job. In light of our own struggles with suffering, evil and death, please consider reading the

entirety of Job during the coming weeks and into the season of Lent.

The complete answer to the problem Job raises is to be found in the Person of Jesus Christ, who died and rose again for the salvation of all humankind. With eyes of faith, we can see beyond this world to the reality of eternal life.

The human person is immortal and after this life there are two possibilities: the wicked who reject God's offer of love will experience eternal separation from Love for all eternity, while those who love him in return and do his will in this life will attain eternal life with the Holy Trinity (which is Love).

Fr. Norm Trela Update

As of February 1, 2024, Fr. Norm Trela has moved into permanent residence at Franciscan Village in Lemont, Illinois.

This is a tough transition for Fr.

Norm and for those who love him.

Fr. Norm has been a mainstay on the southwest side of Chicago for a long time; as an associate pastor at St. Symphorosa, as the chaplain for St. Laurence High School, and as the retired priest in residence in the parish rectory.

This journey to transition began a few months ago when Fr. Norm fell in the parish office and broke his shoulder. He's been through numerous surgeries already and had been rehabilitating at Franciscan Village.

The Vicar's Office for the Archdiocese of Chicago, in consultation with his nurses and

doctors, has firmly recommended Fr. Norm move to a facility that is more conducive to his present needs. He will have his own space, and he will also have the attentive daily care he needs.

Please allow Fr. Norm some time to get settled. Keep him in your prayers. And yes, he can receive letters, cards, and personal visits.

Once the winter weather breaks, we plan to have a thank you celebration for Fr. Norm here at the parish. We will work with Fr. Norm on a day and time. He has given so much of his time, treasure, and talent to this community. We can gather as a parish for Holy Mass and to say thank you as he begins his new assignment as the "Pope of Franciscan Village."

During the offertory and the preparation of the gifts on the altar, you'll notice that the priest and the deacon say some prayers in a quiet voice. We've already talked about the Berakah prayers ("Blessed are you, Lord God..."), but there are a few more. One is during the preparation of the chalice, one is as the priest bows to the altar, and the last is as the priest washes his hands.

The deacon, or the priest in his absence, is responsible to prepare the chalice by mixing wine made from grapes with a small bit of water. As he does this, he speaks these words: "By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity."

In ancient times, water and wine were often mixed to improve the quality and safety of the water, which would come from cisterns, jars, or other sources of stagnate water. It's not a practice that we need to use today due to water filtration and purification.

However, you can see the theological significance of this

action. As the prayer alludes to, the water symbolizes humanity that, without divine intervention, remains idle and unsafe. The added wine of divinity cleanses the water and binds to it. The mixing in the chalice during Mass dates back to 250 AD. St. Cyprian wrote: "Because Christ bore us all, in that he bore our sins, we see that by the water, people are signified, while in the wine, indeed, the blood of Christ is shown. And when the water is mixed with the wine in the cup, the people are made one with Christ, and the multitude of believers is coupled and joined to him in whom it believes."

Additionally, when mixed, the water and wine cannot be separated. Jesus Christ, from the moment of the Incarnation, is forever true God and true man.

As the Council of Chalcedon clarified in 451 AD, Jesus' two natures persist in his person "without confusion, change, division, or separation." Christ elevates humanity to be united with the divinity God intended in the creation of man.

The mixing of water and wine also symbolizes the blood and water which flowed forth from Christ's side when he was pierced on the cross. This was a foreshadowing of the sacraments of salvation that would be given to the Church, namely Baptism and the Eucharist.

Once the Berakah prayers are complete and the water and wine are mixed, the priest bows and says, "With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight this day be pleasing to you, Lord God." This prayer speaks of our humble offering on the altar and the direction in which the sacrifice is being offered.

The priest's last action before beginning the Eucharistic prayer is the ablution. He washes his hands and says, "Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin." Not only does it serve a sanitary purpose of cleaning one's hands, but it speaks of what is about to happen. The priest, by the power of God, is going to consecrate the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. This final prayer is the priest asking God that he remembers his own sinful humanity and it is by the power of God that the priest is able to offer so great a sacrifice.



RESTORE THE CHURCH BUILD THE FUTURE




