Impatience ranks in the Top Ten of confessed sins.

This is not an official poll, but it is my experience as a confessor when people come to me for the sacrament of reconciliation.

They confess their impatience; impatience with their spouse, impatience with their children, impatience with their aging parents.

I must confess impatience, too; impatience in traffic, impatience in the checkout line, impatience with myself. What's the old saying? Patience is a virtue.

What helps, at times, is to remember how patient God is with us; both humanity as a whole and us as individuals. The second reading on the Second Sunday of Advent touches upon God's patience.

St. Paul wrote, "The Lord does not delay his promise, as some regard 'delay,' but he is patient with you, not wishing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance."

The Lord is, indeed, patient with us. Realizing this helps us, in turn, be more patient with those around us,

and certainly to be more patient with ourselves. God desires that all be saved. We must, however, realize there will come a time when this life ends; either at our bodily death or at the Second Coming of Christ in glory. We don't have forever to get right with God. The time is now.

The season of Advent encourages us to prepare the way of the Lord. He will come again in glory. This is Jesus' promise. The danger with Advent is when we get stuck only looking back in time to His first coming in human flesh.

Yes, we celebrate Christmas, but Advent is also prompting us to look forward. Are we in a good place spiritually? Are we prepared to meet the Lord?

Our culture is spinning. Everyone is in a huge hurry. We all want to get to tomorrow, today. This is not good for the soul, and yet many in our culture don't believe we have a soul. They would say we are just physical beings who will die into nothingness. This is not our belief as Christians. We believe to be true that we are body and soul; and that we are precious in God's eyes.

Every single day is another opportunity for us to grow closer to God and closer to one another.

We learned from yesterday the lessons needed so that we can face today as wiser and more mature disciples of the Lord. In all of it, God

is patient. Like a loving parent, God desires what is best for us, but at the same time God allows us to make our own choices. This was the great risk God took in creating us with freewill. It means we can choose the ways of God, or we can choose against the ways of God.

We can say yes to God or no to God.

Mary, the Blessed Mother, can help us say yes to God as she said yes when the angel Gabriel came to her with glad tidings. God desired to use her in the plan of salvation. She would be the spotless human vessel by which our Savior would enter this world.

We are forever grateful for her yes that led to the very first Christmas and brought joy to the world.

May this Advent season find us growing in patience; patience with others, patience with ourselves, and patience with God.

The Lord's plan will come to fruition. We don't know when. We don't know how. And so, we wait ... patiently, and we prepare ourselves to meet the Lord.

The liturgy we celebrate on earth at every Mass reflects

The liturgy we celebrate on earth at every Mass reflects the heavenly banquet celebrated by the angels and saints in the presence of God.

(Chapter 19) as the great

multitude in heaven cry out

The congregation, led by the choir, sing Alleluia as the priest or deacon processes with the book of the Gospels, often accompanied by altar servers carrying two lit candles. At bigger liturgies, incense is used to heighten the experience of hearing the good news proclaimed. Amidst the singing of the Alleluia, a verse from Scripture is sung, often pulled from the Gospel of the day.

You may notice that the priest pauses at the altar and says a prayer in a low voice. Here is what he prays: "Cleanse my heart and my lips, almighty God, that I may worthily proclaim your holy Gospel." It is a recognition of the privilege of proclaiming the Gospel and the preparation that should be done to share the words of Jesus.

However, the proclamation of the Gospel is proper to the deacon, who receives a blessing from the priest prior to the procession: "May the Lord be in your heart and on your lips, that you may proclaim his Gospel worthily and well, in the name of the Father..." In fact, this exhortation to preach the Gospel is given to a deacon during his ordination: ""Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you now are.

Believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach."

During Lent, the Alleluia is not sung because of the penitential nature of the season. Instead of singing with the choirs of the angels around God's throne, we acknowledge our sins in the light of our savior and practice repentance so that we may again have the honor of worshiping God as the angels do.

Fasting from this word of praise also builds our anticipation of declaring it to celebrate the Risen Lord at Easter.

Every time you sing the Alleluia, know that you are joining in the eternal and constant hymn of praise to our God. If you are ever at a loss for words in moments of joy and celebration, know that a simple "Alleluia!" speaks volumes.

Within the Liturgy of the Word, the proclamation of the Gospel is set apart from the other readings from Scripture. Since it is the words from and about the works of our savior Jesus Christ, we want to ensure proper attention is directed towards hearing these words.

So, it's appropriate that we sing together a song of praise, and where better than to borrow a word than from the Book of Psalms. The word is "Alleluia" or "Hallelujah".

In Hebrew (the language of the Psalms), it means "Praise the Lord", or even more literally, "All hail to Him Who is". It invokes the name YHWH given by God to Moses from the burning bush. It is the last word that appears in the Psalms.

Since it was in Psalms, we know that "Alleluia" is a word that has long been used in liturgies to worship God. More particularly, it expresses a long-held formula of monotheistic faith. It can, and should be used, whenever a believer desires to declare joy in what God has done for them.

The word also appears in the Book of Revelation
