How easily today we can echo the voice of the prophet Habakkuk.

He writes, "How long I cry for help but you do not listen. I cry out to you, 'Violence!' but you do not intervene. Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery? Destruction and violence are before me. There is strife and clamorous discord."

Although the prophet Habakkuk wrote in the period of 605-597 BC, his words resonate in the year 2025. The text of Habakkuk moves from complaint about injustice to a vision of God's judgment on the wicked and finally to a revelation of the glory of God. The book moves from a certain doubt about evil around us to a vision of how God will deal with it and finally to a basic trust in God no matter how bad things may appear to be.

Although we trust God, it's still difficult in our own day and age to witness violence and to be victims of the violence. We, too, cry out, "Violence!" We recognize things are not as they should be. And yet? We're surrounded by violence; not only actual violence in our homes and streets, but also in our "entertainment." I used to regularly watch television shows like Criminal Minds and Law & Order SVU, but I remember a specific episode that simulated the crime scene of a school shooting and I reacted by saying, "I can't watch this kind of stuff anymore." Even though it was fake, I was still taking in the ugliness of violence and its dehumanizing effects.

During October, the Church celebrates Respect Life month. We believe human life is sacred and that every human being has an inherent dignity because we are made in the image and likeness of God.

We bare the spark of the divine. We are not products of random chance. We are not cosmic accidents. We have been loved into existence by the One who is Love (God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit).

When does human life become sacred? The moment of conception. Yes, this is one of our culture's hot button issues, but Mother Church remains strong in her teaching, which is also supported by those who claim human life begins at conception from a more biological approach instead of from a faith perspective. Human life remains sacred all through life until natural death. We are called to see one another through a sacred lens, but when we discard the sacred lens, we become capable of dehumanizing blindness.

Novelist Aldous Huxley, author of Brave New World, wrote, "The propagandist's purpose is to make one set of people forget that certain other sets of people are human."

Well, the propagandists are doing an effective job today in our culture of getting us to see one another as less than human. But there is only one primary Propagandist who, unfortunately, has plenty of our fellow human beings cooperating with his hatred of God, hatred of humanity, hatred of children, and hatred of creation. Jesus refers to this Propagandist as a liar and murderer. Jesus also references the "thief" who comes only to steal, kill, and destroy. The Lord says, "I came that they might have life and have it abundantly."

God is a lifer giver. God is the Author of life. Thanks be to Jesus Christ, life is more than mere biological life. In Greek there is more than one word for life. Two of the Greek words are bios and zoe. Bios means material life/physical life. Zoe, however, means divine life; eternal life. This is the life of grace made available to us by Jesus, and the Lord uses his Church as the sacrament of salvation. Woe to us when we think life is only biology and that when someone's life becomes inconvenient for us, we think we

are justified in murder. We even come up with euphemisms for the word murder so as to soften the reality of what we're actually doing.

Respect for life begins close to home by simply showing respect for your own life. Leo the Great said, "Christian, remember your dignity." We far too often think violence as only being other directed, but for some folks violence can be self directed. People do violence to themselves. They find themselves hating themselves and this we must see as a lie and the work of the Enemy. There are various reasons a person might hate themselves and do violence to themselves, but ultimately we see the "fingerprints" of the liar and murderer. Someone who would never hurt an ant or a fly ends up hurting themselves in some dysfunctional way.

In contrast, a person who does violence to others can be found compensating for their guilty conscience by wanting to appear virtuous in some other area of life. An example would be a husband who physical abuses his wife and children but he also sits on the local school board and helps occasionally at a soup kitchen for the homeless. Another example is someone who openly celebrates abortion but is a staunch advocate speaking out against animal abuse. We can recognize the cognitive dissonance of a guilty conscience. We find ways to justify our violence.

Jesus desires we have life and have it in abundance. This calls us to deepen our relationship with the Lord and to live in a state of sanctifying grace. Imagine a culture of human beings who desire to live a life of grace. One thing is certain, there'd be a respect for God, for one another, or for our own self.

loving God creates man, man turns against God, God sends his Son to live among us and save us through the cross, and the Son ascends into heaven so as to bring humanity into union with that Creator God.

It's important that the proclamation is made, because without it, the Church really is just another organization. However, because she has her source in the saving work of Jesus Christ, she becomes the means by which grace is poured into the world. The fathers continue: "To carry out the will of the Father, Christ inaugurated the Kingdom of heaven on earth and revealed to us the mystery of that kingdom. By His obedience He brought about redemption. The Church, or, in other words, the kingdom of Christ now present in mystery, grows visibly through the power of God in the world."

It really can be tempting to reduce the Church to a charitable yet flawed association of believers. Doing so reduces her to something that can be controlled, manipulated, or ignored. The Church, though, never acts alone, but in concert with and from the Trinitarian Godhead. "The Church has been seen as a people made one with the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit" (LG4).

The council fathers are also careful to state that the Church founded by Jesus Christ is one that flows from the covenants and promises of the Old Testament. From the beginning, God "planned to assemble in the holy Church all those who would believe in Christ. Already from the beginning of the world the foreshadowing of the

Church took place. It was prepared in a remarkable way throughout the history of the people of Israel and by means of the Old Covenant." This isn't a replacement of a religion, but a fulfillment.

We can take a lesson from how the bishops laid out Lumen Gentium by centering it around the kerygma. In a world that is losing belief and a basic knowledge of sin, right worship, and the transcendent, it's essential that we remind both ourselves and those we meet of the whole purpose of Jesus and his Church. Before teaching doctrine, giving sacraments, or moral instruction, Catholics must share the good news that God saves us in Christ. Otherwise, we risk reducing the faith to rules, culture, or routine instead of living from the heart of the Gospel and joyfully sharing freedom in Christ.

While the Catholic Church does have visible, institutional dimensions, such as the pope, bishops, canon law, and parishes, its deepest reality is a mystery of grace, communion, and mission. Next time, we'll look at some of the analogies and metaphors that we (thanks to both the Church and the council fathers) can compare the Church in order to gain a greater understand of her true identity.

One of the first things that the council fathers wanted to do in Lumen Gentium was to remind both the faithful and the world that the Church was not an accident. Due to the involvement of the Church in world history for the past 2,000 years, one could fall into the belief that she is just another institution amidst all the governments and organizations of the world. While she has certainly played a pivotal role in the growth of civilization, especially in the West, regarding the Church as man-made and devoid of divine influence is to see her only on the surface.

The opening section of Lumen Gentium is a masterclass in a presentation of what we call the kerygma. You may have heard Fr. Bob or I use this term before – it has been more popular as the Church in the United States has emphasized the need for evangelization. In Greek, it means "proclamation". Specifically, it refers to the essential proclamation of salvation that is presented by the gospels.

"The eternal Father, by a free and hidden plan of His own wisdom and goodness, created the whole world. His plan was to raise men to a participation of the divine life. Fallen in Adam, God the Father did not leave men to themselves, but ceaselessly offered helps to salvation, in view of Christ, the Redeemer" (LG2). This is the heart of the Catholic kerygma: A






