involves a visible sign (water, oil, bread, wine, words) in which the invisible grace of God comes to us. A sacrament is not magic but, instead, a mystery.

When we intentionally live "in-Spirit," we are moved toward goodness, truth, and beauty. We find the courage and strength we need to live for the greater glory of God. The Spirit of God is a unifying Spirit that helps us toward truth and love.

We must admit, however, that there is another spirit that is allowed to exist that is not at all loving; an anti-spirit if you will. This menacing spirit is anti-Christ and anti-human. It seeks to move us away from goodness, away from truth, and away from beauty. This is the sinister spirit Jesus refers to when he says, "A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy."

The Enemy cannot create so in its rebellion it seeks to steal, slaughter and destroy. Jesus, the Good Shepherd who promised us the Holy Spirit, adds, "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." Look around our culture. Where is the Holy Spirit at work? Where is the anti-spirit at work? Where is life being nurtured? Where is life being attacked and destroyed? These kinds of occasional checks help us to further discern which spirit is at work. We can ask, "Is this the Spirit of God or is this not of God?"

Jesus also said, "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but underneath are ravenous wolves. By their fruits you will know them." (MT 7: 15-16)

When we are truly living "in-Spirit," the good fruits coming forth from us are: love, peace, joy, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." (Galatians 5)

We can use the above-mentioned fruits as a gauge to see how we are doing

living "in-Spirit." These fruits are possible to produce when we cooperate with God's grace and distance ourselves from a life of sin. We do not grow these fruits with our own power. We need grace! We need to live in relationship with the One who is Love.

If the gifts of the Holy Spirit have fallen dormant in our life because of neglect or sin, we can turn to the sacrament of reconciliation to stir things up and restore grace. Serious sins cause us to lose sanctifying grace. It's a matter of spiritual physics. A thorough, honest confession restores sanctifying grace.

We need the Holy Spirit in our lives. We cannot afford to be indifferent right now. If someone were to ask me, "Father Bob, what's one of the most important things a parish needs?" I would have to answer, "We need the Holy Spirit." If we truly have the Holy Spirit, everything else we need will flow from our hearts being IN-SPIRIT.

High school football games were a big part of my childhood.

Because my dad was the former head football coach at Morton West High School and the then Dean of Students, he'd be in the stands along with his wife (my mom) Rita.

These are great memories of Autumn Saturdays in Berwyn, especially enjoying the totally in-the-bun hot dogs from Vesecky's Bakery on Cermak Road and, when the weather turned cool, some homemade hot chocolate from a Thermos.

One of the popular cheers back at that time led by the cheerleaders was "We have spirit yes we do, we have spirit, how about you?" This chant would alternate between the home fans and the visiting fans as both sides boldly declared their team spirit.

This silly cheer from a long-gone era resonates this weekend as we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost and the end of the Easter season. We do have Spirit. Yes, we do. We have the Holy Spirit. We should not underestimate what this means for us as human beings. This truth of the Holy Spirit is much more than a high school cheer because the Holy Spirit is the cause of our sanctification.

When do we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit? On the day of our baptism followed by the fullness of the Holy Spirit in confirmation. We're reminded that a sacrament is the way the Lord communicates grace to us. A sacrament

One of the most noticeable changes that came after the Second Vatican Council was at Mass. In the years that followed, the faithful would more frequently hear entire Masses said in their native tongue, see altars moved forward in the sanctuary, and notice increased lay involvement in the liturgy. While there is still work to be done to make the Mass adhere to the vision of Vatican II, there was no question that something needed to be done regarding the liturgy in the 20th century.

Well before Vatican II opened in 1962, there was a worldwide renewal effort called the Liturgical Movement. Some abuses had crept in, with some priests trying to say Mass as quickly as possible or skipping prayers altogether. The laity attended faithfully, but did not seemingly have much to do until it was time to receive communion. The standard Mass was a "Low Mass", meaning a majority of it was said quietly by the priest with a few servers providing the responses. Many would engage in the rosary or other devotions during Mass.

Most of these practices stemmed from the Council of Trent in the 16th century, when a singular missal and form of Mass was established in the wake of the Reformation. In an effort to ensure the Mass was universally unified, Pope Pius V promulgated the Missal of 1570, which would be the Mass said for the next 400 years. A number of theologians felt that the Church needed to better promote

"active participation" during liturgy by all the faithful, not just priests. As we've learned before, this idea of participation is not about doing or having roles that directly involve us, such as lectors or ushers. Rather, it is offering ourselves to the Father in union with Jesus with the power of the Holy Spirit. It was from the monasteries of Europe that the renewal of liturgy started.

One of the chief theologians, the monk Odo Casel, said this: "The whole church, not merely the clergy, is to take an active part in the liturgy, each according to sacred order, in his proper rank, place, and measure. All members are truly, sacramentally conjoined to Christ their head; every believer, because of the sacramental character he received in baptism and confirmation, has part in the priesthood of Christ the head. This means that the layman does not merely assist with private devotion and prayer at the priest's liturgy, but is, by his objective membership in Christ's body, a necessary and real sharer in the liturgical fellowship."

Other key names during this period are Pope Pius X, Dom Prosper Guéranger, Lambert Beauduin, Columba Marmion, Maurice de la Taille, Virgil Michel, and Romano Guardini. The movement started to introduce different elements into the

liturgy, such as hymns and vernacular language, which prompted a response from the Vatican. In 1947, Pope Pius XII released the encyclical *Mediator Dei*, in which he addressed the need for all to better understand the main focus of the Mass and other sacred liturgies.

He recognized the liturgy's need to develop while maintaining the ancient traditions of the Church. He spoke of how the sacred liturgy unites souls with Christ and sanctifies them through the divine Redeemer, ultimately honoring Christ and the Holy Trinity. Pius wanted to stress what his predecessor, Pius X, had started in emphasizing the primacy of liturgical worship in its superiority over other forms of piety. In clarifying the distinction between liturgy and popular piety, he set the stage for a proper understanding of their relationship.

The liturgical movement's ultimate goal was pastoral: to foster knowledge of and love for the divine mysteries among the faithful and to restore the understanding that these mysteries belong to the entire Church, not just the clergy. Getting liturgy right is essential, because how we practice can affect how and what we believe about God and his plan of salvation.
