Many of you have heard me mention the four "D's" of the diabolic.

The four D's of the diabolic are: division, deceit, diversion, and discouragement. Fr. Lou Cameli, a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago, wrote a book about these four D's. Knowing these can help us become better discerners in the spiritual life between what is of God and what is not of God.

The word diabolic comes from the Greek word diabolos, which basically means "to throw things apart or divide." This is the modus operandi of the Enemy (Satan). The Adversary foments these four D's to try to separate us from God, from one another, and from our own self. The Enemy cannot create so it seeks to destroy what is good, true, and beautiful.

Allow me this week to highlight just one of the four D's; discouragement.

There's a good chance you've been discouraged before. To be discouraged means to have lost confidence or enthusiasm; disheartened. How easy it can be in daily life in this world to become discouraged. This is exactly what the Enemy wants; people losing confidence in God and in our fellow man; losing our enthusiasm as we throw up our hands and say, "What's the point?"

Within the word discouragement we see the word courage. Who had courage? The saints of the Church throughout the centuries. Amid trials and tribulations, the saints allowed the Holy Spirit to give them strength and courage as they carried their respective crosses in this life all the while preparing for passing into eternal life.

When we read the stories of the saints, we find inspiration to keep on living for the greater glory of God. We're able to put our discouragements into proper perspective. We recognize the diabolical work of the slithering serpent for what it is; anti-love and anti-Christ.

The saints had courage because the saints primarily kept their gaze on Jesus. They may have glanced away on occasion amidst the tumult of the world, but they would return to prayer, scripture, sacraments and the works of mercy to regain focus and be reminded of our reason for hope. Our reason for hope is the crucified and risen Lord.

Here's a sports analogy to help paint the picture. A tactic used by a sports team is to dis-spirit the opposing team; to get the other team to lose confidence and hope. A discouraged team is easier to defeat. This is true whether it's football, basketball, baseball, soccer, or volleyball. We must realize the Enemy and its cooperating minions are trying to discourage us every single day so that soon we, too, will just throw up our hands in defeat.

Look at our culture today. Look at our news media. We are feasting on deceit, division, diversion and, yes, discouragement. Heck, maybe it's more profitable from a dollars and cents perspective, but our souls are suffering. Human beings are hurting.

Relationships are suffering. People are discouraged and losing hope amidst increasing violence, institutional corruption, soaring greed, and perverse debauchery.

What are we to do? Look to the saints who teach us to look to Christ. We make use of what the saints made use of: prayer, Holy Mass, scripture, sacraments, devotions, and works of mercy. We don't need to reinvent the wheel. Maybe our wheel just needs air; the "air" of the Holy Spirit at work in our lives so that we are given the strength and courage to love God and to love our neighbor.

Jesus was a carpenter; someone who builds, and He's building a kingdom on earth one "yes" at a time until He comes again in glory and declares, "Behold, I make all things new."

It's true. Evil may have its hour, but God will have His Day.

Quote -- "In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world." -- Jesus (John 16:33)



The meaning of "active participation" has been one of the more misunderstood teachings from the Second Vatican Council. In the years following the council, it was interpreted as giving people more jobs to do during the Mass – ushers, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, etc. While these ministries do exist and are ways of serving the Lord in the liturgy, it's not what the Liturgical Movement nor the Council Fathers had in mind when they included this term.

Active participation was an essential aspect of Sacrosanctum Concilium. After establishing the centrality of Christ in the liturgy, the fathers dove right into this concept: "Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people, is their right and duty by reason of their baptism" (SC14). The concern was that liturgy had turned into a spectacle, with the priest and servers performing and the rest of the congregation watching until it was time to receive communion.

It's natural to hear "active" and not think about doing something, especially in our American context of performance and efficiency. In this sense, the action is external and

visible; people should be able to see that something is being done. This has led to unnecessary actions and roles being added to the liturgy in the name of participation, while others feel they remain on the sidelines because they aren't performing one of these observable roles.

Joseph Ratzinger, who would become Pope Benedict XVI, wrote about this his book "The Spirit of the Liturgy". As an expert theological advisor at Vatican II, he envisioned that participation referred to a principal action in which everyone has a part. This central action is the Eucharistic prayer and offering. These are more than just words, but the action of God that takes place through human speech.

It is the action of God inaugurating the new creation and restoring the ability for each person to communicate with God. We pray that the sacrifice of Jesus Christ becomes our sacrifice, transforming us into the Body of Christ. As Ratzinger states, "The uniqueness of the Eucharistic liturgy lies precisely in the fact that God himself is acting and that we are drawn into that action of God."

So how is this done? The simplest way is that each takes up their liturgical role. The priest, sacramentally empowered to offer the prayer and sacrifice, leads the liturgy, but his participation is equal to the worshipping faithful. For the laity, this means listening attentively to the word of God, responding in the dialogue with the priest, and presenting a personal offering alongside the bread and wine.

Sacrosanctum Concilium states it beautifully: "The Church earnestly

desires that Christ's faithful, when present at this mystery of faith, should not be there as strangers or silent spectators; on the contrary, through a good understanding of the rites and prayers they should take part in the sacred action conscious of what they are doing, with devotion and full collaboration. They should be instructed by God's word and be nourished at the table of the Lord's body; they should give thanks to God; by offering the Immaculate Victim, not only through the hands of the priest, but also with him, they should learn also to offer themselves; through Christ the Mediator, they should be drawn day by day into ever more perfect union with God and with each other, so that finally God may be all in all" (SC48).

At Mass, we become engaged at all levels of our being. This is the "active" or "actual" nature of our participation. We sing, stand, kneel, and process with our bodies, we open our minds and hearts in reception to God's word and grace, and we offer our whole selves in worship of God. Ratzinger refers to it as training the body for its eventual resurrection where God is fully accepted and conformed to. The theme of full and active/actual participation will continually return as we dissect Sacrosanctum Concilium.




