FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG



On the morning of **Sept. 11, 2001**, I was sitting at my desk in the newsroom of a small daily newspaper in DeKalb County. The Associated Press newswire was on my computer screen. A story popped up about a plane crashing into the World Trade Center. Not too long after that story came another story; a second plane crashed into the towers.

Soon the newsroom TV was turned on and we saw first-hand what was happening in lower Manhattan. We can all remember the thousands of people rushing away from the area. As those folks were rushing away, police officers, firefighters, paramedics and other first responders were rushing TOWARD the scene. That's what they do. They respond first to whatever incident needs them, and they do it with courage. Those who died that horrific day remain in our prayers.

After Communion at our Noon Mass this Sunday, we take a moment to say thank you to our local police officers and firefighters (active and retired) for their service. We will offer them a small token of our appreciation before we offer them a blessing. They need our support and encouragement, and we need them. **Thank you!**

Big Picture, Little Picture

Any casual student of human history knows the human race is troubled.

This world is not heaven. Bad things happen. We can trace this all the way back to the Garden of Eden incident and to the first recorded homicide when Cain murdered his brother Abel (Where were the parents?)

We know we are created good; very good, but because of The Fall, we humans have an inclination toward sin. Even if we've been baptized, where the stain of Original Sin was washed away, we are still left with concupiscence (fancy theological word for attraction to sin).

If we're being honest with ourselves, we know this is true. We desire to be good, but we know there is a force that tugs on our heart and seeks to pull us away from good toward what is not good (and in extreme cases, cooperation with evil).

The Good News is that Jesus brought with Him restoration. The kingdom of heaven is at hand in this world. Please note: We're not in heaven, and yet, we have heaven-sized expectations even as we live each day in this wounded world.

Who among us hasn't recently said or heard, **"What is wrong with the world?"** However, this question could have been asked by witnesses to the Lord's Passion; an innocent man being mocked, spat upon, beaten, whipped and, finally, crucified. It would be on the cross of Calvary that God was beginning to set things right as the Lamb of God shed blood to take away the sins of the world.

Evil can't comprehend the crucifix. Love understands sacrifice because authentic love is self-sacrificing.

Love wants what is best for the other, and there is no greater sign of love in this world than God the Son in human flesh nailed for our sake to the wood of the cross **(I love you THIS much).**

We draw from the merits of the cross every time we participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We literally go to Calvary and rest at the foot of the cross. This is our redemption. And at every Holy Mass, the Lord feeds us His very own Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharist.

He speaks now from every altar across the planet Earth, **"This is My Body given up for you."**

Lord, help us see how you are our Savior. We need not live in fear because Love is stronger than death. Jesus has conquered sin, evil and death. Help us to live in union with You.

Guide us, Lord, as we make our pilgrim way Home to be with You forever.

The heaven-sized expectations we have in our hearts now will be satisfied only by You when you bring all things to fulfillment, and we shall see You as You are.

FR. KEVIN'S GREGORIAN RANTS

In every group we join, we take on some role as a member of that group. Perhaps we are the leader, the planner, the financial expert, the feeder, or something else that helps to ensure the group runs smoothly, remains on task, and stays united.

No one person is meant to fulfill all these roles, but each person is expected to give something to the group and not simply reap the benefits.

The liturgy is no different. As we learned, any liturgy is a work directed toward God offered on behalf of the people. The main actor is Jesus Christ, as only he is able to offer the perfect sacrifice desired by God the Father.

However, since we are members of the Body of Christ, each of us is called to participate in the liturgy and fulfill the role we have been given.

The priest leads liturgical worship at each Mass and is the one who stands in the place of Christ to offer the bread and wine along with the sacrifices placed on the altar by all in the congregation.

There are also functional roles that

are required to make the Mass flow and be done in accord with the tradition we have been passed.

These include lectors, altar servers, ushers, cantors, and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion.

There is a danger in thinking that if we don't have one of these functional roles, then we aren't actually participating in the liturgy.

If we reduce participation to just carrying out external liturgical duties, then we are impoverishing the liturgy and turning it into a show that is viewed by a bunch of spectators.

Leading up to and at the Second Vatican Council, the council leaders stressed the concept of "full, active, and conscious participation" in liturgy. Here, active is more than just doing things, but actualizing or realizing authentic participation.

This means we are not engaging in mindless ritual, but are instead fully aware of what we are doing.

Again, the main way we participate at Mass is interior: we offer ourselves from our hearts, completely to the Father, just as Jesus did and continues to do.

The exterior things we do help us to complete that primary interior task and to do so as the unified Body of Christ offering ourselves to God. The standing, sitting, kneeling, responding, singing, and hearing is not just an exercise in how well we can follow directions.

There isn't an act we do during Mass that doesn't have a purpose.

The dialogue between the priest and the people is of utmost importance because it gives voice to the interior dispositions of us as the faithful collectively worshipping God.

The responses promote communion between the priest and the people, as well as reminding us of and teaching us who God is and how he acts.

Each response is simple yet beautiful because they are full of fundamental truths about ourselves and our God. God reaches out to us through sacramental signs, and we respond.

I encourage you to join in all the responses at each Mass with your brothers and sisters. Find yourself meaning each of the words you say and letting yourself be formed by these words.

If you find Mass boring or non-beneficial, ask yourself what you are putting into it with your interior disposition of offering and your external responses that make the interior realities known.

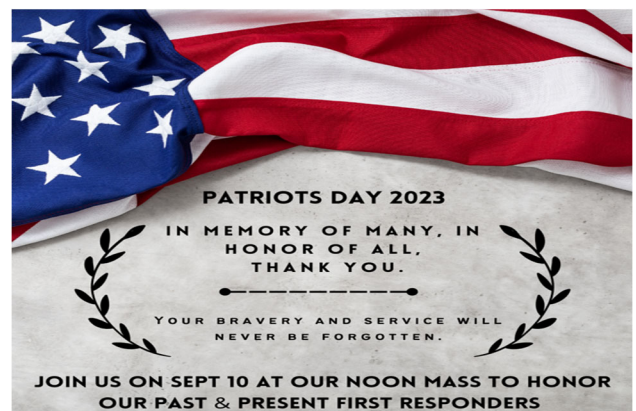

Good evening. I am sorry you have not heard from me because I was waiting for the letter of Good Standing to be signed by the Bishop/Superior of the Ad Gentes Missionary Fathers. The name of the Priest who is coming on September 9/10, 2023 is Rev. John Paul Ezesuokwu, AGM. He is our first Ad Gentes Missionary priest, a religious, and a parish priest in one of the areas of the northern part of Nigeria where priests are kidnapped almost weekend and families are either killed or displaced. He also serves as a Spiritual Director to the Ad Gentes Missionary Brothers/Fathers/Sisters. He was ordained in 2015. Since his ordination, he has worked in the diocese of Koudougou in Burkina Faso and Minna in Nigeria.

The Ad Gentes Missionaries live and work amongst the Christian minority in the midst of Islamic sect, in the Catholic Dioceses of Koudougou in Burkina Faso, Minna in Nigeria and Ngaoundere in Cameroon. We provide alternative education to children, men and women who have not have opportunity of going to school. As well as offer "free" English Language training to the youth in Koudougou through "Radio Media" programs; we also teach different vocation/skills/agriculture programs to enable them sustain themselves.

In Minna Diocese, we opened a center where street kids, school drop outs, abandoned teenage mothers, youths could avail of literacy programs, agricultural/community development, healthcare/hygiene, skills and vocational programs. We also provide care to Pre-natal and post-natal teenage mothers and their families.

Our school and skills academy serve 358 children. In the adult section, we have over 15 young men and 58 young mothers. And the number keeps on increasing. These families cannot afford to pay tuition so we have to provide tuition free program for them or send them back to the streets or abused homes.

Our young Seminarians also avail of the Catechist training. The youth are very enthusiastic in learning the work of the Catechist and if provided for, are very efficient in helping the priests to reach out to areas in the remotest part of our missions.

This year all our Faith Formation Classes will be held at our St. Symphorosa Campus.

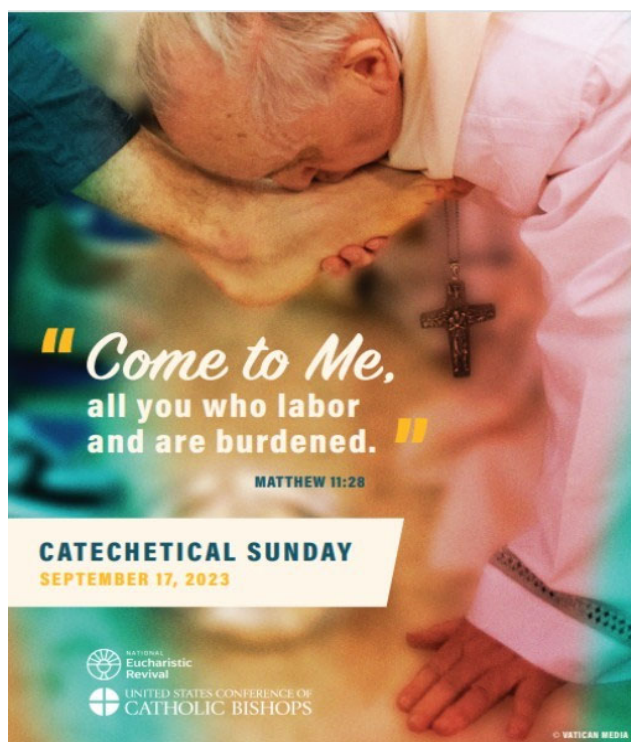


PREPARING FOR CONFIRMATION
