Wait, what? Ash Wednesday is next week?

That is correct. We are just days away from entering the Church's penitential season. This year, Ash Wednesday happens to fall on February 14th. Some priest friends playfully joke about making the ashes in the shape of a heart, but in all seriousness, when our forehead is marked with the cross, we are being reminded of God's love for us.

Let's recall John 3-16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

Sometimes we forget the significance of the cross of Christ. Crucifixion was the Roman Empire's method of execution, which was done publicly to serve as a deterrent to would-be criminals or insurrectionists. God, however, uses this evil for a much greater good – our salvation. Jesus says, "This is My Body given for you ... this is My Blood."

Why? Because love does such things. We are being shown what AGAPE looks like. This is self-sacrificing love that directs us to the Love that transcends this world.

## FR. BOB'S WEEKLY BLOG

During Lent we remember we are not God. This might be news to some folks today who embrace the cultural trend of selfishness and pride. Keeping a God-first approach to life keeps us humble and attentive to what truly matters in life. As we hear on Ash Wednesday, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

With this reality in mind, we find the HOPE we need in the Person of Jesus. His desire is to transform minds and hearts in this life. The Lord is looking for intentional disciples; those who truly answer his call to "Follow me!"

Here's the tough part of being a true disciple of the Lord. It involves the cross. This means our lives will, at times, involve hardship and sacrifice. Our natural human instinct is to shy away from this or ignore it altogether.

Jesus says, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." (MT 16: 24).

The Lord gives us courage and strength so that in sharing his cross we are mindful we shall also share in his resurrection. The cross becomes the portal to new life in Christ.

Here's a question to ponder as we enter Lent: what must die for new life to grow? We can use the image of gardening. What needs to be pruned and cleared out so that something new can grow? We can ask this question both individually as disciples and communally as brothers and sisters in Christ.


Lent is the time of year to root out what keeps us from growing deeper in love with Jesus and closer together as Christians. The seven deadly sins serve as a checklist of what needs weeding out. They are pride, lust, gluttony, greed, sloth, anger, envy.

The compensating seven lively virtues are: humility, charity, kindness, forgiveness, chastity, temperance, and fortitude.

Sin shrinks the heart. Grace enlarges the heart. That's why we refer to a self-centered person as having a cold heart, and we refer to a generous, forgiving person as having a warm heart. This is spiritual physics 101. Hatred shrinks the heart. Love enlarges the heart.

May your Lent be blessed. May God's grace wash over you. May you grow closer to our crucified and risen Lord. Please pray for your priests, and know we pray for you.

Now that the gifts and the altar are prepared, the priest can begin, along with the congregation, the eucharistic prayer. By the end of this prayer, the bread and wine will have been consecrated by the hands of the priest into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Much like the Collect, or opening prayer, which is prayed before the readings from scripture, the priest offers a prayer at this point, which is appropriately called the Prayer over the Offerings. This prayer is "proper" to the day, meaning that, like the Collect, it changes depending on which Mass is being said.

This prayer, also like the Collect, is directed toward God the Father, and each one typically ends, "Through Christ our Lord." The people respond "Amen" in their agreement. While the Collect directs the general direction for each Mass, the prayer over the offerings is directly applied to the gifts that are about to be consecrated.

Often, the language speaks of what we hope to gain by the offering of the bread and wine, along with all the intentions and sacrifices that have been placed on the altar

by those present. It reminds us that we are going to be directly affected by the gifts that are placed on the altar.

For example, let's look at the prayer for this Sunday, the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time: "May this oblation, O Lord, we pray, cleanse and renew us and may it become for those who do your will the source of eternal reward. Through Christ our Lord."

First, the prayer speaks of "this" oblation. It's not the offering made last week, nor the one that will be made a year from now. Each Mass has its particular set of offerings and as Christians, we are asked to be present to what is happening in the here and now.

Second, we ask that the sacrifice we offer do something for us through the power of God. Here, we ask for renewal and restoration in our current state of life, and also look forward to what we are promised: eternal life. You will find that many of these prayers have an eschatological aspect, which is a word we've discussed before.

Every liturgy we celebrate is a participation in heavenly liturgy and a foretaste of heaven. The gifts we offer and receive back now profit us for eternal life to come.

Finally, we always bring it back to Jesus Christ. Everything done at Mass is done towards the Father through the Christ the Incarnate Word and in the power of the Holy Spirit.

It's almost as if we are reminding both God the Father and ourselves that all of this is possible because of the Incarnation, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We also recognize that man alone is not capable of receiving these gifts without the grace given by Jesus.

Each prayer over the offerings will have similar elements. If the Mass is in honor of a particular saint, often the prayer will mention that saint to ask for his or her intercession. Sometimes it will mention a specific gift or virtue the Church desires her people to have.

Think of the prayer over the offerings said aloud by the priest as our "last chance" to place our offering on the altar. God is about to perform a great miracle through the priest, and so great an action calls for attentive and active preparation.




