

# Fr. Bob's Weekly Blog



Amazing what kinds of things we remember from our youth.

One of my best friends was Tim, and I was so jealous how close he lived to our grade school. He literally could leave home one minute before the bell and arrive on time. How cool! There was also something else about Tim's family that stood out. One of his grandmothers lived in their house.

Grandma Herron had a room right off the kitchen. This was foreign to me, but I'd learn this was rather common back in the day. We didn't see her much. She spent most of her time in that room, but occasionally she'd venture out.

This was part of what being family was all about. They could have put her in an old folk's home, but they didn't. She lived in the same home as her son's family until her death.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. They give us an amazing model of family. We certainly need it in this day and age.

Family is so important. Of course, no human family is perfect. Imagine how Joseph must have felt living under the same roof with the Incarnate Son of God, and a woman who was immaculately conceived. And yet Joseph knew his role and lived in accordance with God's will.

If we're being honest, every family has some level of dysfunction. Some have it much tougher than others. At the end of the day, however, family is family. It's important that the Holy Family be a part of EVERY family. A family that prays together stays together.

Be honest. Is prayer part of your family life? As I look back into my own child-hood, I am not sure we even prayed before Christmas and Easter meals. Why didn't we? I don't know. There are some families that regularly pray the Rosary together.

Imagine a family in crisis. They certainly want to be able to use prayer to cope. Sadly, prayer is often mocked in our society, as if it has no purpose. We often see the reaction from some folks after another tragic shooting. They say things like, "We need better laws not more prayers." Um, well, yes, we might need better laws, but why mock prayer in the process?

For those who do not have much family anymore, please know you always have your Christian family, and you always have the Holy Family to walk with you and guide you. God could have come among us in some other way, but God chose to enter time and space through the human family. That's important to think about, especially when the model of family is under attack.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!

#### **New Year's Resolutions**

If by some chance you are making a New Year's resolution, here is something to keep in mind. You cannot change a bad habit unless you replace it with a good habit.

Some folks just want a bad habit to go away. Unfortunately things don't work that way.

What needs to happen is that we file away a vice by embracing its corresponding virtue. For example, if you struggle in the area of lust, you want to begin living a chaste life. If you struggle with pride, you want to move toward humility. If your thing is greed, move toward generosity.

Very few of us can just stop a vice. We need to live into virtue.

In all things, pray for grace. Pray that you find the courage and strength to distance yourself from vice and walk more in the way of virtue.


We invite everyone to join us for our next "Super Bingo/Raffle" on Sunday, January 19.

## Catholic Vocabulary - What Does it Mean?

#### Mixing of Water and Wine

Ancient liturgical practice still used at the Preparation of the Gifts at Mass. Water was customarily used in the Palestine of Christ's day to dilute wine, which tended to be heavy. When used in the Liturgy this utilitarian action came to be given a symbolic religious interpretation. In the West, the mixing represented our Lord's union with His faithful—as wine receives water, so Christ takes us and our sins to Himself. In the East, the wine and water represented Christ's human and Divine natures. The accompanying prayer reminds us that through the Eucharist we are to share in the Divine dignity of Christ, who became incarnate for us.

# Our Catholic Faith By Fr. Bob Regan

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

Sometimes you just need to step aside and allow a wise person to speak. That's the case in this week's Our Catholic Faith. St. Padre Pio was a wise and holy man, and so what follows are his words for our consumption and contemplation.

- 1. Today's society does not pray, that is why it is falling apart.
- 2. Prayer is the best weapon we possess, the key that opens the heart of God.
- 3. Pray, hope and don't worry. Worry is useless. Our merciful Lord will listen to your prayer.
- 4. Endeavor to unite the simplicity of children with the prudence of adults.
- 5. Do not be so given to the activity of Martha as to forget the silence of Mary. May the virgin who so well reconciled the one with the other be your sweet model of inspiration.
- 6. It would be easier for the world to exist without the sun than without the Holy Mass.
- 7. A thousand years of enjoying human glory is not worth even an hour spent sweetly communing with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.
- 8. In the spiritual life he who does not advance goes backward. It happens as with a boat which always must go ahead. If it stands still the wind will blow it back.
- 9. You must speak to Jesus with all your heart, besides the lips; indeed, in certain cases you must speak to him only with your heart.
- 10. God loves man with an infinite love and when he pushes he does so with reverence, almost fearing to hurt.
- 11. Do not worry over things that generate preoccupation, derangement and anxiety. One thing only is necessary: to lift up your spirit and love God.
- 12. Thank and sweetly kiss the hand of God that strikes you, because it is always the hand of a Father who strikes you because he loves you.
- 13. Where there is no obedience, there is no virtue; there is neither goodness nor love. And where there is no love, there is no God. Without God, we cannot reach Heaven. These virtues form a ladder; if a step is missing, we fall down.
- 14. The field of battle between God and Satan is the human soul. It is in the soul that the battle rages every moment of life. The soul must give free access to the Lord so that it be fortified by him in every respect and will all kinds of weapons; that his light may enlighten it to combat the darkness of error; that it be clothed with Jesus Christ, with his justice, truth, the shield of faith, the word of God, in order to conquer such powerful enemies. To be clothed with Jesus Christ, it is necessary to die to oneself.
- 15. Do not fear. Jesus is more powerful than all hell. At the invocation of his name every knee in heaven, on earth and in hell must bend before Jesus; this is a consolation for the good and terror for evil.
- 16. To doubt is the greatest insult to Divinity.
- 17. He who attaches himself to the earth remains attached to it. It is by violence that we must leave it. It is better to detach oneself a little at a time, rather than all at once. Let us always think of heaven.
- 18. Time spent in honor of God and for the salvation of souls is never badly spent.
- 19. Do you not see the Madonna always beside the tabernacle?
- 20. You must have boundless faith in divine goodness, for the victory is absolutely certain.



#### RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults


