Fr. Bob's Weekly Blog



“Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every joint with which it is supplied, when each part is working properly, makes bodily growth and upbuilds itself in love.” Ephesians 15: 15-16

During my hiatus from the intentional practice of my faith, I'd occasionally be channel surfing in the evening and come across the Jack Van Impe Show. He's an American televangelist who regularly seemed to be forecasting the end of the world.

With wife Rexella by his side, the duo would tie Sacred Scripture into the world news events of the day. Part of his shtick intrigued me. I'd get lured into contemplating when the world might end and Christ would come in glory.

There have been many other folks who made it their business – often profitable (not prophet-able) – to predict when the End Times would come. Time and time again, they've been proven wrong.

Our readings during the last weeks of the liturgical year take on an End Time theme. It's true, there will come a time when God brings all things to fulfillment, but in today's Gospel, Jesus does not directly answer the question posed to Him. “Teacher, when will this happen?”

The Lord goes on to explain some difficult things that will precede His coming, but He does not say exactly when it will happen. We need not trouble ourselves with WHEN. Instead, we use each and every day to remember the WHY and the HOW of our Catholic Christian faith.

Why? God's love. How? Follow Jesus.

We need not spend time in endless worry about the end of the world if we keep God's love front and center, and

if we follow the way, truth, and life of Christ. If however, we do turn away from God's love, and reject the way, truth, and life of Christ, then worry is understandable.

What did Jesus say about worry? “Can any of you, for all his worrying, add one single cubit to his span of life?”

Erma Bombeck wrote, “Worry is like a rocking chair: it gives you something to do but never gets you anywhere.”

Amen to that!

As the Serenity Prayer says, “God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference.”

What can we change? Our hearts ... by God's grace.

Breaking Bread Hymnals

Starting on the first Sunday of Advent, the Breaking Bread hymnals can be found IN THE PEWS.

We will no longer have the two carts in the narthex by the doors. Every pew throughout the St. Rene church will have the hymnals in the racks.

We doubled the order this year and we no longer have to remember to grab a hymnal on the way into church. We hope this is a welcome change.

We do ask that the hymnals be handled with care. The usual wear and tear is to be expected after 12 months of usage, but we've seen some hymnals with entire pages torn out and the cover torn in the corners. Please, do your best to

handle the hymnals with care. We need them for an entire year.

New Children's Library

Also starting the first Sunday of Advent is our Children's library. We will have available a certain number of faith-themed books for parents to use for their young children before Mass (and, if need be, during Mass, but don't say I said this).

Please feel to use one of the books. They will be located in the narthex on a book cart. These books appeal to a few different age levels. Some books are basically pictures with minimal verbiage, while others are more detailed. Choose as need be.

Can you borrow a book to take home? We'd discourage this, but it's not out of the question, as long as the book comes back in good shape and in a timely fashion. We want others to be able to use and enjoy these books.

Catholic Vocabulary - What Does it Mean?

Advent

The Latin means coming or arrival. This season begins the new liturgical year for the Church on the fourth Sunday before Christmas. This season prepares Christians ascetically and liturgically for the appearance of the Lord. It begins on the Sunday closest to the feast of St. Andrew (Nov. 30) and therefore falls between Nov. 27 to Dec. 3. Primarily penitential in spirit, the Season also reflects His second coming. For the people of God there should be a third coming between these two, namely, His current presence in the hearts of all the faithful by his grace.



Our Catholic Faith

“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age.” Matthew 28:19-20

Friends, we live now in a post-Christians society.

What does this mean? Our culture is being rapidly secularized. The word secular means “denoting attitudes, activities, or other things that have no religious or spiritual basis.”

If we deny this, then our heads are in the sand. We cannot afford for our heads to be in the sand.

This does not mean, however, folks don’t believe in God. Many people do. If you ask a good number of persons, “Do you believe in God?” A majority will answer “yes!” If you ask them, “What religion to you identify with?” the growing answer today is “none.”

Why is this? My opinion is that people have increasingly lost faith in human institutions over the past few centuries, and especially in the post World War II era. This loss of faith includes those who have left the Catholic Church, or have simply drifted away. The sins of some of Her bishops, priests, and nuns have saddened and sickened people. “How could truth be found in such a twisted church?”

You will also hear people say, “All religions are the same. So it really doesn’t matter.”

Okay, Fr. Bob, where are you going with this? Well, we cannot afford -- in this day and age -- to sit back in comfort, pat ourselves on the back, and say “job well done.” Where are the voices of influence today using the name of Christ as a possible solution to all that ails us as a society?

One name making waves the past couple weeks is Kanye West, of all people. He dares to openly speak the name of Jesus to those who’d rather he shut up. Whether his conversion is authentic or not is to be seen. Only God truly knows Mr. West’s

heart (and your heart, by the way). Some of the stuff he is saying are truths our priests and bishops should be saying, but instead too many of our spiritual leaders sound more like they are in cahoots with the wayward culture than they are shepherds of Christ.

Our country is now mission territory. Our state is now mission territory. Our county is now mission territory. Our city is now mission territory. The Clearing area of Chicago is now mission territory.

This means we are ON for bringing the Good News (Gospel) to those who either have not heard it, who have forgotten it, or who have rejected it. It takes a disciple to make a disciple. We share the story of Jesus, who died not to make bad people good, but to make dead people live. He showed us the way, and the truth and the life. That’s why we call it GOOD NEWS! For, indeed, it is good news.

A common objection we hear is, “I don’t need religion to be a good person.” Perhaps! But we do need Jesus to lift us from death to life. That’s interesting, and that’s the core of our faith.

God, through time and space, has given us a concrete avenue to guide us in this life as we prepare our hearts for the next. The people of Israel were the first light God chose, and this people melded into the Church via the Light of Christ. She is THE light shining in the darkness, and the darkness of her sinners NEVER cancels out the Light of Christ.

So many people are looking for some other way than the path Jesus established for us. Their hearts are hungry. Keep that in mind as we do our part as disciples to help the Lord satisfy those hungry hearts.


Faith Formation Classes
